



#### PRIVATE PRAYER FOR A SPIRITUAL COMMUNION

Dr. Jan Eberhard, The Park Church: Some people are watching from a location where they do not have actual Holy Communion Bread and Wine with them. We offer the following prayer for them based upon a prayer from the Episcopal National Cathedral Prayer book for a Spiritual reception of Holy Communion. This prayer assures all the benefits and blessings of a physical reception.

Oh, My Jesus, I believe that you are truly present in the Blessed Sacrament of the Altar. I love you above all things, and I welcome you in my soul. Since I cannot now receive you in the Sacrament of your Body and Blood, come spiritually into my heart. Cleanse and strengthen me with your grace, Lord Jesus, and let me never be separated from you. May I live in you, and you in me, in this life and the life to come. Amen.

#### **Invitation to the Table**

Rev. Hubman: Because there is one loaf, we, who are many, are one body, for we all partake of the one loaf. The bread which we break, is it not a sharing in the body of Christ?

ALL: It is!

Rev. Horton: The cup over which we give thanks, is it not a sharing in the blood of Christ?

ALL: It is!

Rev. Behrens: Come from the East and the West, from the North and the South and share in the bread and the wine made holy. The Gifts of God for the People of God. Take them in remembrance that Christ died for you, and feed on him in your hearts by faith, with thanksgiving.

Rev. Benedict: Instructions to Receive Holy Communion

- 1) For everyone, in church and watching virtually: Please use the top pullback seal for the Communion bread. Together everyone online and in the church receive the Holy Communion Bread of Life.
- 2) Again, please pullback the second seal for the Communion wine or grape juice. Now we receive the Holy Communion Cup of Salvation together.

Those in church: after receiving Communion, place the empty container in the metal cup holder under the chair in front of you.
