The Bread Of Life, week 4 of 5

We are continuing in our special series on the story of the Church as seen through the seven letters to the seven churches in the Book of Revelation. Today we consider the fifth church, Sardis-Reformed church (A.D. 1520-1790 to the Tribulation) pages 72 – 77 in Revelation Unveiled.

Climate Change today and tomorrow.

In Revelation 16:8-9 we read the Fourth Bowl Judgment will bring scorching heat of the sun. Here is the text: Fourth Bowl: Men Are Scorched

⁸ Then the fourth angel poured out his bowl on the sun, and power was given to him to scorch men with fire. ⁹ And men were scorched with great heat, and they blasphemed the name of God who has power over these plagues; and they did not repent and give Him glory.

During the last third, roughly, of the seven-year Tribulation Period God will authorize the seven bowl judgments. When the fourth bowl is poured out on the Anti-Christ's kingdom people will contend with a heat wave from the sun as never before experienced. People will not be able to go outside as their skin will be scorched "with fire" (verse 8). Keep in mind this judgment is falling on those who are blaspheming God and following the rule of the Anti-Christ. Believers will be kept safe from all of these judgments.

Years ago I was laughed out of apartment where I was teaching this portion of the Book of Revelation. Friends and Members of Ray Of Hope said this is never going to happen because Science shows the climate would never become that hot. That was in the year 1994. This is twenty-seven years later and we are facing a much warmer experience of our climate .

This week the United Nations Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change released its annual report.. "As the world's latest and most rigorous scientific assessment of the physical basis of climate change, the report defines changes that are unprecedented in thousands if not hundreds of thousands of years. It emphasizes that there is still time to act, but it must happen immediately." Source: <https://www.un.org/en/climatechange>

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+ Thoughts on Today's Gospel.

Today is the fourth of five Sundays the lectionary schedules a slow study through the sixth chapter of John. **THE BREAD OF LIFE.**

With these verses, we have the summary and cause of the debate that continues to this very day: What is the Real Presence in the Eucharist, and what is it for.

Read all the current definitions on our website at the Sacraments page. At Ray Of Hope, you are free to participate in the worship life and hold your own position on the Real Presence of Christ in the bread and the fruit of the vine.

Please keep separate these three ideas:

1) Real Presence: specific to the actual presence of the risen and ascended Lord Jesus Christ. Christ is here.

2) Purpose of Real Presence: What is it for?

a) FOR SACRIFICE: Roman Catholics and some Orthodox and some reformed churches: Every time we ask for the real presence of Christ in Holy Communion, it is so we can physically participate in Christ's own re-presentation of Himself to God in sacrifice. This idea is held primarily by those who maintain a strict separation between the clergy and the Laity. In this view, only the clergy can participate in the re-presentation of Christ in the very act of renewing the sacrifice of the cross. This is why His real presence is necessary so that He can be re-presented in the ongoing sacrifice of the cross.

b) FOR SPIRITUAL NOURISHMENT: Christ is really and truly present in the Blessed Sacrament to nourish the Body of Christ, the people, the believers with Himself. He truly goes into our bodies and strengthens us to do God's will. His real presence is necessary to strengthen us in ways the world will never be able to, and it is a separate (holy) communion (common-union) with Christ.

3) Transubstantiation: This theory put forth by St. Thomas of Aquinas attempts to use philosophy to explain HOW the bread and wine change (trans) their substance (substantiation) from normal bread and wine into the actual Body and Blood of Christ but still their taste does not change. It is a theory. Martin Luther modified it to Consubstantiation, with, through, and in the elements. Transubstantiation and Consubstantiation are not necessary for Christ to be truly present. These were theories to attempt to explain how that change may be happening.

The Dead Church

"And to the angel (or messenger, or pastor) of the church in Sardis write,

'These things says He who has the seven Spirits of God and the seven stars: "I know your works, that you have a name that you are alive, but you are dead. ² Be watchful, and strengthen the things which remain, that are ready to die, for I have not found your works perfect before God. ³ Remember therefore how you have received and heard; hold fast and repent. Therefore if you will not watch, I will come upon you as a thief, and you will not know what hour I will come upon you. ⁴ Nevertheless you have a few names even in Sardis who have not defiled their garments; and they shall walk with Me in white, for they are worthy. ⁵ He who overcomes shall be clothed in white garments, and I will not blot out his name from the Book of Life; but I will confess his name before My Father and before His angels.

⁶ "He who has an ear, let him hear what the Spirit says to the churches."

+ Sermon: Series: The state of the Church according to the seven letters to the seven churches in the Book of Revelation

"In the Revelation, Christ discloses the course of the life of the Church to her perfection at the end (BEDE). Writing to seven churches, John is in fact writing to all churches and to all ages, for the number seven represents the present life (APRINGIUS, ANDREW OF CAESAREA)."

PERTAINING TO ALL THE CHURCHES. APRINGIUS OF BEJA: What is the importance of the people of Asia that they alone deserve to receive the apostolic revelation? However, there is a mystery in the number and a sacrament in the name of the province. First, let us discuss the meaning of the number, because both the number six and the number seven are always used in the law with a mystical meaning: "For God made heaven and earth in six days," and "on the seventh day he rested from his works"⁸ and "on it," it says, "they shall enter again into my rest." The number seven, therefore, signifies the period of the present life, so that the apostle is not merely writing to seven churches and to that world in which he was then present, but it is understood that he is giving these writings to all future ages, even to the consummation of the world. Therefore, he mentions the number in a most holy manner, and he names "Asia," which means "elevated" or "walking," indicating that celestial fatherland which we call the "catholic church." For exalted by the Lord and always moving toward the things which are above, it is the Church which advances by spiritual exercises and is always desirous of the things of heaven. TRACTATE ON THE APOCALYPSE 1:4.¹

In this study of the seven letters, we will make a chart that has four parts:

- A) Commendation: What Christ approves about this Church.
- B) Condemnation: What Christ disapproves about this Church.
- C) Counsel: What Christ suggests to this Church.
- D) Challenge: What Christ offers to those who accept the instruction and act upon it.

We will review the seven stages of the Church as **cumulative, qualitative, and quantitative**. Each stage is cumulative or incremental as it builds in succession on the previous stage and continues forward. Each stage is qualitative as we measure the qualities (good, bad, or indifferent). Finally,

each stage is quantitative as we measure the growth or decline of the actual population of persons in each stage of the Church. Notice many of these characteristics of each stage of the Church's story continue to the present day. When the study is over, we will look at the chart and use it as a starting place for our self-evaluation to improve and celebrate our successes.

As I present this series, it will be from three perspectives.

There is the **historical perspective** – who, what, where, when, and why. The **prophetic perspective** – what prophecy is here, was some of it or all of it fulfilled by now, and is some of it or all of it to be fulfilled in the future.

Thirdly, the **spiritual perspective** – what universal lessons are revealed and how they might be applied in our present lives.

Introduction to part 6

1) Summary: Each of the seven churches are reviewed through the lens of four categories (commendation, condemnation, counsel, and challenge). All of these qualities seem to continue on to the conclusion of the Church Age, including the church of the Tribulation Period. Contemporary church congregations focus and display some or all of these qualities to greater and lesser degrees. Like the Apostolic Church, many communities work tirelessly to do good works for the general society. They work a bringing the Gospel to places where it has not been received or even thought about, both on domestic soil and in other countries. Like the Persecuted Church, there are many places on this planet where Christians are slaughtered for no other reason than they believe in Jesus and practice the Christian faith. There are many articles on contemporary persecution. Here is one: One In Eight Christians Live in Countries Where They May Face Persecution; Forbes Magazine January 13, 2021

persecution that leads to imprisonment or death sentences, there is non-bloody persecution within Denominations, where people are cast aside, not allowed to progress through the education that leads to leadership or kept from affordable employment within a denomination. I could write a book on this topic.

Going on. Pergamum. Churches that have the material resources to do great works like build hospitals, build universities, open homeless shelters, and such are in every Denomination. It takes very focused people to administer large and influential institutions in the Name of Jesus. The Church of Thyatira, the Roman Church, and her "catholic" offspring are all over the world today. Many local congregations, many religious orders, many associations of laypeople, many ecumenical groups work together to continue works of charity, works of mercy, works of empathy and compassion.

All of these good qualities continue in the current chapter of the Church Age in 2021. All of them are available to us as a small and faithful congregation. These good qualities are available to us as we work with other faith communities in our area.

2) Historical Background: Today, we are briefly discussing the church of the Reformation ca. 1500 to 1800 a.d. Many factors caused the explosion that we call The Reformation. Some were purely political as regional wealth was restored to Europe in the 1,000 years following the fall of the Roman Empire. Cities became States, and States became Countries. During this evolution, the ongoing tension between a unified world under the Supreme Pontiff for Christ and the power of the national cluster around commerce or ethnic tradition or royal families continuously played out. In Europe, the great universities often started in the High Middle Ages began to break away from Papal oversight and stand on their own with more focus on regional strengths and historical traditions. The Encyclopedia Britannica gives the following list:

"From the 13th century on, universities were established in many of the principal cities of Europe. Universities were founded at Montpellier (beginning of the 13th century) and Aix-en-Provence (1409) in [France](#),

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at [Padua](#) (1222), [Rome](#) (1303), and [Florence](#) (1321) in Italy,
at [Salamanca](#) (1218) in [Spain](#), at Prague (1348)
and [Vienna](#) (1365) in central Europe,

The article goes on to state these universities were sharply divided into two groups during the Protestant Reformation and the Counter-Reformation: Protestant or Catholic. Largely, they were all taken up with defending evolving dogma and doctrine as Denominations formed mainly along geographic lines.

Interest in Science would have to wait for the seventeenth century before it began to take over the concept of university education.

In the later 18th (1700's) and 19th (1800's) centuries, religion was replaced by modern learning, where research and the scientific method were brought to the center of attention.

As worldly power was expanding, some of the countries of Europe began to move to other continents and establish their "Christian" culture and government. Again, this is consistent with both the Ammillennial and Postmillennial viewpoints.

Universities also formed in the Western Hemisphere: the University of Santo Domingo – 1538 in the Dominican Republic and the University of Michoacan (western Mexico) – 1539 were Christian universities. The first four-year college in North America was Harvard – 1636, William and Mary – 1693, and King's College, now Columbia in 1754. While most American colleges were indeed religious establishments along denominational lines, they would all evolve into secular schools by the 19th Century.

Again, any treatment of these issues in this short sermon is an immeasurable understatement of the essential facts.

Some things that caused the Reformation.

1) Immeasurable separation of the clergy from the Laity. All of the ministry was invested in the clergy and organized into these steps of ascension, with the highest being the Supreme Pontiff of Rome, the Pope.



As the Reformation progressed into the 1800's these ministries were returned to the Laity as they are at Ray Of Hope. **explain each one.**

2) To further separate the Laity from the clergy, a terrible dogma developed that human sexual contact defiled a person from holiness. To varying degrees, sexual intimacy was devalued, and only those who would vow to refrain, abstain, and live in chastity from all forms of sexual intimacy and pleasure were allowed to ascend to the steps of the "clerical state." People

who were family building were told their vocation was lower than those who voluntarily took upon themselves an asexual lifestyle for the church. All other forms of sexual expression (other than what we call heterosexuality and chastity) were considered the worst of sin and even deserved death. The damage this has done to the human race is immeasurable.

The concept of Ordination became wildly exaggerated. The Laity were pushed into servitude to the clergy as a proper place in society. Here is a quotation from the Catechism of the Council of Trent for Parish Priests. This edition was printed in 1937. These ideas were firmly in place.

Bishops and priests being, as they are, God's interpreters and ambassadors, empowered in His name to teach mankind the divine law and the rules of conduct, and holding, as they do, His place on earth, it is evident that no nobler function that theirs can be imagined. Justly, therefore, are they called not only Angels, but even gods, because of the fact that they exercise in our midst the power and prerogatives of the immortal God. (pg.318)

Here we see the term Angel used of pastors. This is one of the interpretations of the opening to each of the seven letters; "To the angel of the church of ----- "

The term "alter Christus" another Christ is still in use. (Pope Benedict: [Right Click Here](#))

Regarding ordinations conducted on June 11, 2021 we read: "To highlight the solemnity of the moment of ordination of the priest, nothing is spoken aloud during the imposition of the hands. As in the silence of the Consecration, when Our Lord comes down to the altar, so too in the stillness of that Virginia morning, Our Lord descended upon the newly ordained priests to transform them into *alter Christi*." (page 24 July, 2021Catholic Family News)

The Sacraments were formed and provided by the ordained male clergy. The Laity, including all women religious, could only hope for the privilege of having an ordained male provide the graces they needed for salvation.

Even salvation itself was severely blurred by reshaping it into only being available through the ministerial hands of the priesthood. Purgatory left people in fear their entire lives that they and their relatives would not have immediate access to salvation. The people were told they were not saints. The term "Saints" was reserved for a specific list of heroes the male clergy created. Even women who dedicated their lives to the church as sisters and nuns were never raised out of the state of being Laity. All formal ministry in the clergy was denied to women. Ultimately a dogma was developed that anyone who left the Church of Rome could not be saved. So, even babies who might die before the opportunity for baptism were not allowed to be buried with the members of the Church. Today you can still see sections of cemeteries where unbaptized babies are buried, sometimes without names on their gravemarkers.

Ultimately the reform became nationalistic, forming around the universities that were in place. As a result, customs of music, language, and liturgy developed more by local custom than by established Roman Tradition.

Unfortunately, this often led to very cold non-liturgical "services" where the majority of the established order of worship was a sermon. In many places by the 1800's worship had become very predictable with singing, preaching, altar calls, offerings received, final blessing, and sending forth. Holy Communion was no longer a weekly celebration and even fell into a once or twice a year event on some locations.

3) Rev 3:1a "And to the angel (or messenger, or pastor) of the church in Sardis write, 'These things says He who has the seven Spirits of God and the seven stars:

As in other introductory sentences to each of the churches, Jesus gives a self-revelation. Jesus has and is the seven Spirits of God, the Holy Spirit, and the seven gifts, and Jesus holds the seven stars, the seven churches. The implication is the Church of Sardis, the Reformed Church that goes cold

over time, has had every opportunity to know the Truth and obey the Lord in every way.

A) Commendation: What Christ approves about this Church.

4) Rev 3:1a "I know your works, that you have a name that you are alive,

LaHaye notes this is the shortest of all the commendations. However, some commentators write this may be a reflection of how well the reform started with great minds like Martin Luther and the fact that they set out to grow and change.

5) Rev. 3:1c: but you are dead.

In less than one hundred years, the Protestant denominations of Europe had replaced all that focus on form with a new emphasis on new forms. Rules were replaced with new rules, etc. LaHaye writes: "...the ritual and ceremony of the Reformation Church often crowded out the true-life underneath so that it was impotent and ineffective in the hand of God. This is defined in verse 2 by our Lord's statement, 'for I have not found your deeds complete in the sight of my God.'" LaHaye, Tim. Revelation Unveiled (p. 74). Zondervan. Kindle Edition.

C) Counsel: What Christ suggests to this Church.

6) Rev. 3:2-3a ² Be watchful, and strengthen the things which remain, that are ready to die, for I have not found your works perfect before God. ³ Remember therefore how you have received and heard; hold fast and repent.

Five things:

1) Be watchful; wake up. Have an attitude of looking forward to the Lord's return. With all that was reformed, eschatology was not until 1850. Therefore, the reformed churches firmed up Amillennialism and began to function in time, space and in place simply.

2) Strengthen what remains. Strengthen the good doctrines, dogmas, teachings, and practices.

3) Remember, therefore, how you have received and heard; Go back to days of blessings and seek those healthy lessons, search Scriptures, and review Tradition for all that is good and act upon it.

4) Holdfast or obey it. Adhere to Doctrines (using the term to refer to unchangeable truths found in Scripture) and do not allow these to be changed. Instead, change everything that has fallen away from Doctrine and restore the Scriptures as the source of every Doctrine.

5) and repent. Have a submissive attitude or heart. Be humble and return to Christ as head of the Church. Avoid replacing old preconceived ideas with new ones. Keep it simple.

7) Rev. 3:3b Therefore if you will not watch, I will come upon you as a thief, and you will not know what hour I will come upon you.

The established denominations of the reformation churches all adopted Amillennialism not because it was reviewed and decided upon but just because it wasn't. Then when eschatology was reviewed and renewed in the 1850's and following, the established churches maintained their positions. Some even have published statements that show disfavor for the premillennial point of view, even knowing it was the position of the ancient Church.

8) Rev. 3:4 ⁴ Nevertheless you have a few names even in Sardis who have not defiled their garments; and they shall walk with Me in white, for they are worthy.

LaHaye: "As in all church ages, the Reformation had individuals who were faithful to their Lord. They saw through the pageantry of ornate religious sacraments and ritual and came to the personal acceptance of Christ as Savior and Lord. Because of this faith in Him and obedience to His Word, they 'have not soiled their clothes,' that is, have not compromised with the attitude and conduct of the world, and

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rather chose to live a separated and godly life." LaHaye,
Tim. Revelation Unveiled (p. 76). Zondervan. Kindle Edition.

D) Challenge: What Christ offers to those who accept the instruction and act upon it.

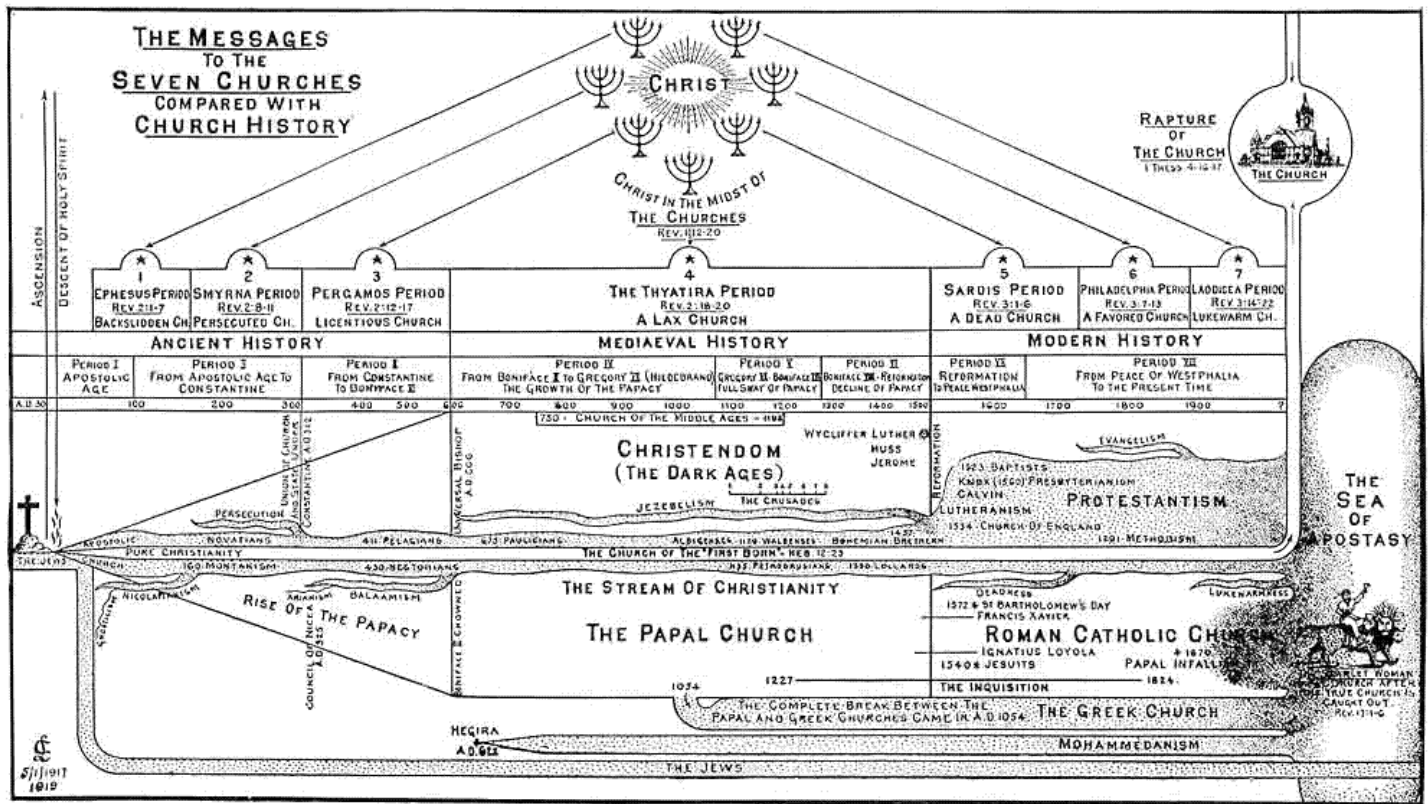
9) Rev. 3:5 " He who overcomes shall be clothed in white garments, and I will not blot out his name from the Book of Life; but I will confess his name before My Father and before His angels.

⁶ "He who has an ear, let him hear what the Spirit says to the churches."

Again the challenge is directed to the individual in this Church. Once we are born again, we are clothed in the righteousness of Christ (2 Cor.5:21 For He made Him who knew no sin *to be* sin for us, that we might become the righteousness of God in Him.)

The believer is forever inscribed into the Book of Life and does not have to face the Great White Throne Judgment of the wicked dead. Christ is our Advocate before the judgment of God.

The Spirit has just told you what the Holy Spirit has been saying this entire age, listen, understand, and follow to the faithful conclusion of this way of life, the Paradise of God. We can do this!



We pray that all God's people will one day be reassembled without the loss of anyone in your kingdom of love and glory. We ask this through Christ our Lord.

+ **Invitation to the Lord's Table**

Pastor: At this time I ask you to lift with me the Blessed Sacrament.

Pastor: Behold the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world. Behold Jesus truly present in the Bread of Life, and the Cup of Salvation. Behold Him who said whoever eats of this Bread and drinks of this Cup though they die they shall live forever. (John 6:50, 51, 54) Blessed are those who come to His Table. All are welcome.

ALL: Lord, you make me worthy to receive you, and by your Word I am healed. (This prayer is credited to Fr. James Callan, Spiritus Christi of Rochester, NY.)

Pastor: Please set down the Bread and Cup at this time.

Pastor: I assure you, by the promises of Christ, that anyone who receives this Holy Communion today will surely live forever and be raised by Christ to new life.

PRIVATE PRAYER FOR A SPIRITUAL COMMUNION. Some people are watching from a location where they do not have actual Holy Communion Bread and Wine with them. We offer the following prayer for them based upon a prayer from the Episcopal National Cathedral Prayer book for a Spiritual reception of Holy Communion. This prayer assures all the benefits and blessings of a physical reception.

Oh, My Jesus, I believe that you are truly present in the Blessed Sacrament of the Altar. I love you above all things, and I welcome you in my soul. Since I cannot now receive you in the Sacrament of your Body and Blood, come spiritually into my heart. Cleanse and strengthen me with your grace, Lord Jesus, and let me never be separated from you. May I live in you, and you in me, in this life and the life to come. Amen.

Spiritual Communion Prayer from the Episcopal National Cathedral Prayer Book.

A spiritual communion is a personal devotional that anyone can pray at any time to express their desire to receive Holy Communion at that moment, but in which circumstances impede them from actually receiving Holy Communion.

Pastor Benedict: Communion is now served. Everyone is invited to receive Holy Communion at Ray Of Hope Church. It is not required that you be a member of this Church or any other church to receive Holy Communion. This is the Table of Jesus Christ, He invites you to come and receive Him in this Eucharistic banquet.

When you come forward, the person serving you will say; "The Body and the Blood of Jesus Christ for you." Respond with "Amen" or "Alleluia" or some other acclamation of appreciation or faith. Then take a piece of the bread and dip it into the cup and serve yourself. If you are here with family or friends you may come to Holy Communion together and serve each other. Please wait after you receive Holy Communion because the person serving you will pray with you before you return to your seat.

Serving Holy Communion today will be: _____

We sing during Holy Communion and maintain our worship. We begin. The Table of Christ is served.

If we understand the Real Presence of God is with us in Christ through the powerful ministry of the Holy Spirit, we will experience more confidence, love of ourselves and our neighbors, and be able to feel better about our lived experience. WHO SHOULD RECEIVE HOLY COMMUNION, THE EUCHARIST, AT RAY OF HOPE CHURCH?

Everyone is invited to receive Holy Communion, also known as The Eucharist, The Lord's Table, or The Blessed Sacrament at Ray Of Hope Church Of Our Lord Jesus Christ, Inc.

It is not required that you be a member of this Church or any other church, to receive Holy Communion at / or with Ray Of Hope Church.

This Holy Communion is the Table of Jesus Christ, who is really present among us. Jesus invites you to receive Him in this Eucharistic banquet. If this is your first time receiving The Blessed Sacrament, let us know before you receive or right after, so we might pray a special prayer of thanksgiving with you.

Unfortunately, through the centuries many institutional churches have established rules, teachings, and practices that would

exclude people from Holy Communion. There has been an almost endless list of reasons to exclude people from the Blessed Sacrament. Yet, together, during the worship service, we recite the very words of Jesus, the Words of Institution, "This is my body. This is my blood," and we rehear Christ present with us saying: "Take this, all of you and eat; Take this all of you and drink" of this gift.

I have thought about this extensively and have decided to take these words "Take this, all of you.." as a command to the Church to give, and bring, the Eucharistic Gift to everyone who will receive. This approach also requires us to teach people about this gift. I have stated in other places, **it is uniquely and deliberately the work of Christ in His Church** to offer the necessary education, guidance, and practices that help people live a life centered and purposed on finding and sharing the Will of God. The Lord's Table is central in that life.

The Eucharist belongs to the Church. The Blessed Sacrament is Christ in us, through us, and with us; made known in the breaking of the Bread of Life and drinking of the Cup of Salvation. We are to take this gift to the whole world.

We begin by inviting those who are on the fringe of society, those who have been pushed aside, those who are poor, who are not accepted, who are sick, who need God's help in special ways. We welcome and bring the Eucharist to everyone who has been told they cannot receive it by other Denominations. In conclusion, to all persons who have ever been told "no you cannot" go to Communion in any other church, hear us, "yes you can" at Ray Of Hope. All are welcome. Or as we like to say as one of our mottos, when we quote Fr. Bartholomew J. O'Brien; "You are as welcome here as Christ Himself."

Come to the Table of the Lord. There is a place set for you too.

I am including this information here to assist people who may want to take action now to encourage their members of the Senate of the United States to know the facts and identify the false information being put forth in the hearings that are happening now on the Equality Act. Dear Friend,

Last month the House passed the [Equality Act \(H.R. 5\)](#). For those unaware, this important legislation would amend existing civil rights laws, such as the *Civil Rights Act of 1964*, to include sexual orientation, and

gender identity as protected characteristics under law. The bill also expands federal non-discrimination protections regarding discrimination based on race, color, national origin, **Religion**, sex, sexual orientation or gender identity in public settings, and protects against sex-based discrimination in government services and federally-funded programs.

This week, the Senate held its first ever hearing on the [Equality Act](#) and as expected, the debate was heated. It seems opponents of the bill (Senate Republicans) are promoting [several misconceptions](#) about its purpose and scope which include:

- *"The Equality Act would destroy religious freedom in this country."*
 - **NOT TRUE.** Freedom of Religion is already protected by the First Amendment of the U.S. Constitution. Nothing in the *Equality Act* would change that. The bill simply extends those rights that most vulnerable groups are already afforded to those who have been denied them, such as the **LGBTQ community**. In fact, the bill actually protects freedom of Religion by preventing the imposing of one's Religion upon another.
- *"The Equality Act will make athletics unfair for females."*
 - **NOT TRUE.** Schools across the nation already have policies in place to ensure a level playing field for all students, and they are working. Additionally, except for a very small percentage, most students who participate in high school sports do not continue on with their athletic endeavours after high school. The possibility that perhaps one or two transgender students in an entire student body would ruin that opportunity for another is [almost nonexistent](#). *Title IX* is extremely important in regards to girls athletics, and the bottom line is that **nothing in the Equality Act changes that**. Instead, we should be calling for increased funding for girls athletics.
- *"The Equality Act will allow men to harass women in public restrooms."*
 - **NOT TRUE.** We already have laws in place to prevent such acts, and the *Equality Act* does nothing to change that. Additionally, **21 states** have had similar nondiscrimination laws on the books for decades now and they have worked, as there have been no increases in public safety incidents in bathrooms since they were codified.


