Our St. Francis and St. Clare of Assisi bell at Ray Of Hope Church, 380 W. 1st St. in Elmira, NY, is a gift from Michael Quinnell of Syracuse, NY, given in September 2005. The bell rings out 39 joyful rings, in contrast to tolling the bell in single rings. The 39 joyful rings honor the 39 lashes Jesus endured, and we now celebrate victory and gratitude for our Salvation. "The chastisement for our peace was upon Him, And by His stripes, we are healed." (Isaiah 53:5) We ring the bell before worship and Bible Enrichment sessions. Listen carefully and see if you can hear all 39 rings.






The first reading is the Book of Exodus, Chapter 3, verses 1-6 and 13-15, in the NRSV 2021 updated edition. The 1989 pew Bibles have a similar reading on page 50 in the First Testament.

3 Moses was keeping the flock of his father-in-law Jethro, the priest of Midian; he led his flock beyond the wilderness and came to Mount Horeb, ^[a] the mountain of God. ² There the angel of the LORD appeared to him in a flame of fire out of a bush; he looked, and the bush was blazing, yet it was not consumed. ³ Then Moses said, "I must turn aside and look at this great sight and see why the bush is not burned up." ⁴ When the LORD saw that he had turned aside to see, God called to him out of the bush, "Moses, Moses!" And he said, "Here I am." ⁵ Then he said,

Jesus Is Named

When the eighth day came, it was time to circumcise the child, and he was called Jesus, the name given by the angel before he was conceived in the womb.

Jesus Is Presented in the Temple

When the time came for their purification according to the law of Moses, they brought him up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord ²³ (as it is written in the law of the Lord, "Every firstborn male shall be designated as holy to the Lord"), ²⁴ and they offered a sacrifice according to what is stated in the law of the Lord, "a pair of turtledoves or two young pigeons."

Now there was a man in Jerusalem whose name was Simeon; this man was righteous and devout, looking forward to the consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit rested on him. ²⁶ It had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he would not see death before he had seen the Lord's Messiah. ^[b] ²⁷ Guided by the Spirit, Simeon ^[c] came into the temple, and when the parents brought in the child Jesus to do for him what was customary under the law, ²⁸ Simeon ^[d] took him in his arms and praised God, saying,

- ²⁹ "Master, now you are dismissing your servant in peace, according to your word,
- ³⁰ for my eyes have seen your salvation,
- which you have prepared in the presence of all peoples,
- ³² a light for revelation to the gentiles and for glory to your people Israel."
- ³³ And the child's father and mother were amazed at what was being said about him. ³⁴ Then Simeon blessed them and said to his mother Mary, "This child is destined for the falling and the rising of many in Israel and to be a sign that will be opposed ³⁵ so that the inner thoughts of many will be revealed—and a sword will pierce your own soul, too."
- ³⁶ There was also a prophet, Anna the daughter of Phanuel, of the tribe of Asher. She was of a great age, having lived with her husband seven years after her marriage, ³⁷ then as a widow to the age of eighty-four. She never left the temple but worshiped there with fasting and prayer night and day. ³⁸ At that moment she came and began to praise God and to speak about the child^[e] to all who were looking for the redemption of Jerusalem.





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THE TREASURER'S REPORT FOR NOVEMBER, 2024, given by Ed Askins, Treasurer, at the December 19, 2024 of the Church Council.

General Fund opening balance at the beginning of November was \$401.88. Donations to the General Fund for the month were \$2,592.31. This included undeposited funds of \$77.67 which hit the bank early December. Pastoral compensation of \$495.00 per week for 4 week was paid equaling \$1980.00, Verizon \$62.38 and Paypal charges of \$24.64 came out of this account.

After these were paid the ending balance of this account at the end of the month was \$849.50.

Building Fund opening balance was \$1,134.08. Donations to the Building Fund were as follows: Brother Shawn Benedict \$640.00, Kaiden Benedict \$450.00. Regular bills that came out of the fund this month was the Credit Card bill with Key Bank of \$58.51, electric \$590.92, gas bill \$253.00, and the water bill of \$112.01. Ending balance of this fund was \$1,209.64.
