We need an epiphany. We need an epiphany. What is an epiphany in God-consciousness? With today's Gospel reading we begin a series of readings over the next few weeks where we study epiphanies that happened in the adult life of Jesus of Nazareth that showed forth the truth that He is "God from God, Light from Light, True God from True God." (Quotation from the Nicene Creed 325 A.D.)

Today's epiphany in the Gospel reading; the visitation of the magi from far-Eastern lands. Magi were what I like to call "religious specialists." They had studied the Scriptures and were very aware that this was the time for the God/child to be born and be Messiah. There was a group of magi who arrived in Jerusalem to inquire where he was. There is no Biblical references to their number being three and there is no reference to them being kings. They were, magi, religious specialists.

However, speaking of love and peace, we stop and pray for all the people in the war still raging in Ukraine. We pray to end these hostilities that started approximately 318 days ago. Russia invaded Ukraine on February 24, 2022. The Winter conditions are very harsh when the power system is not functioning. It is frigid in Ukraine these days.

January 6 original Christmas Nativity Mass, still is in some sections of the world Church Prophecies in the Book of Daniel reveal when the Messiah would appear on the world stage, when he would die, and when he would set up his Universal kingdom. The date of his death was therefore the 14th of Nissan, the first Spring month on the Hebrew calendar.

Calendar at the time of Daniel was the lunar 30-day month calendar. Then there was the Julian Calendar until 1582 and then the modern Gregorian – a solar calendar with leap years. The Eastern Church was using a Greek calendar. There is a great note on this at Matthew 2:1 at the word "born" on page 1301 of your Scofield III Bibles. However, the church generally agreed until very recently that this meant Jesus died on April 6 after the calendar conversions were reconciled. A **Tradition** then followed that Jesus was conceived on the same date. Therefore, he was born on January 6. In 336 the Roman Empire began to formally celebrate Christmas on December 25, by the authority of the Emperor Constantine. Constantine declared Christianity to be the prominent religion of the Empire. By the fourth century, two dates had gained preeminence: Roman Calendar December 25 in the west, and January 6 in the east. Although the modern Armenian church continues to celebrate Christmas on January 6, December 25 ultimately prevailed, and January 6 was recast as the feast of Epiphany, commemorating the arrival of the Magi in Jerusalem. The period between these two dates constitute the famous "twelve days of Christmas." These are celebrations, not historical dates. In 1870 Christmas was declared a federal holiday. (see pages 29-33 Tim Dowley The History of Christianity © 1970, 1990 Lion Publishing)

Some quotations from "Born To Be King" by Dom Bernard Orchard, O. S. B. beginning on page 51.

[&]quot;We now come to an incident in the early life of Jesus that is related only by Matthew; Luke, who knew our Gospel of Matthew, makes no mention of the flight into Egypt at all, thus ignoring entirely a period of some four to five years

in the childhood of Jesus. But then there was no need for him to repeat what the evangelist Matthew had already adequately recorded. The child had already grown into a toddler; and everything was going on nicely when all of a sudden a party of distinguished visitors came to the village and knocked at their door. ... They proved to be a deputation from the East, and had been guided to the door by a special star which they claimed to have first seen in their own country, and which had led them to Jerusalem in their search for the king promised of old to the Jews."

Magi (<u>Latin</u> plural of *magus*; <u>Ancient Greek</u>: μάγος *magos*; <u>Old Persian</u>: *maguš*, <u>Persian</u>: غن *mogh*; <u>English</u> singular *magian*, *mage*, *magus*, *magusian*, *magusaean*; <u>Kurdish</u>: *manji*) is a term, used since at least the 6th century BC, to denote followers of <u>Zurvanism</u> or <u>Zoroaster</u>. a practitioner of magic, to include astrology, alchemy and other forms of esoteric knowledge.

The word *mágos* (Greek) and its variants appears in both the <u>Old</u> and <u>New Testaments</u>. The Strong's Concordance says "magician, i.e. Oriental scientist; by implication a magician; - sorcerer, wise man. Ordinarily this word is translated "magician" in the sense of illusionist or fortune-teller, and this is how it is translated in all of its occurrences except for the Gospel of Matthew, where it is rendered "wise man". However, early church bishops and theologians, such as <u>St. Justin</u>, <u>Origen</u>, <u>St. Augustine</u> and <u>St. Jerome</u>, on up to the fifth century did not use the term "wise men," but transliterated the word in its ordinary sense, i.e. as "magician".

The Magi are found in every ancient civilization

From a previous bulletin: The prophet Daniel was taken into the court of eunuchs to serve King Nebuchadnezzar in Babylon some six hundred years earlier. The eunuchs were often

court magi and were called upon to interpret King Nebuchadnezzar's dreams and give him direction. In one particular dream God revealed to Nebuchadnezzar the empires of the world to the end when Messiah would set up His Kingdom.

Nebuchadnezzar called upon his magi to 1) tell him the content of the dream, and 2) give him the interpretation. He set a serious standard this time; the magi who failed to give the dream and interpretation were put to death for failing to guide the King. The prophet Daniel was able through the powerful ministry of the Holy Spirit to tell the king his dream and to interpret it.

Therefore, since Daniel was successful, in Babylonian culture, Daniel became one of the magi and was elevated to being the chief magi for some forty years and he held a position of great respect and power. Scholars suggest Daniel influenced the writings of the prophecies of the Babylonian and then the Persian Zorastrian magi to know that a divine child king, would come from Israel and he would be God's anointed Messiah deliverer for all humanity. Those same magi would have been familiar with Daniel's writings where he predicted that 483 years after the Jewish people would be released from captivity, the Messiah, King, saving child would come. (Daniel 9:25-26). THE SAME DATING PROCESS MENTIONED ABOVE THAT INFORMED BOTH THE ROMAN WESTERN AND GREEK EASTERN CHURCHES FOR THE DATING OF THE BIRTH. Perhaps some of the Magi remained faithful to the true God Daniel introduced them to. These might be some of the magi who went to Jerusalem to wait, watch, and pray for the birth of the coming King. Now that it had happened, we have the account of Matthew telling us they were convinced that these prophecies would have been recently fulfilled.

The magi studied the skies and star patterns as one of the sources of religious knowledge. The gospel tells us a new manifestation was showing in the skies and the Magi recognized it as the star that would guide them to the divine child.

It has been pointed out that Herod was likely terrified to see Parthian magi and troops coming into Jerusalem looking for a newborn king of the Jews! These magi were from enemy territory.

Catholic and Protestant theologians are in agreement that the redaction of the event into three kings, who are later assigned the names Caspar, Balthasar, and Melchior, each bearing one gift, and

each king representing the three main groupings of the human race (one is black, one is asian, and one is euro-centric and white) is mostly the result of Medieval legends, mystery plays, sacred plays that were presented in public--*. The gifts are variously interpreted as gold for the kingship of Christ, incense for his divinity, and myrrh for his redemptive suffering. Sometimes the gifts are said to represent virtue, prayer, and suffering. The gifts are definitely partial fulfillment of the prophecies of Isaiah 60:6,11,13 and Psalm 72:10-11.

2) Transgender Inmate Executed in Missouri (https://gaycitynews.com/transgender-amber-mclaughlin-executed-missouri/) Amber McLaughlin, 49, was executed on January 3.

A transgender woman serving on death row in Missouri was executed by lethal injection on January 3 in a case that raised serious questions about judicial fairness and featured transphobic rhetoric by the state's governor during the final hours of her life.

Officials in Missouri said Amber McLaughlin, 49, died at 6:51 p.m. local time at Eastern Reception, Diagnostic, and Correctional Center. Multiple news reports described McLaughlin as the first out transgender person to be executed under the death penalty in the United States.

McLaughlin was serving time for raping and killing her ex-girlfriend, Beverly Guenther, in 2003. She was convicted in 2005, but the jury in St. Louis County deadlocked after failing to deliver a sentence.

WHO SHOULD RECEIVE HOLY COMMUNION, THE EUCHARIST, AT RAY OF HOPE CHURCH?

Everyone is invited to receive Holy Communion, also known as The Eucharist, The Lord's Table, or The Blessed Sacrament at Ray Of Hope Church Of Our Lord Jesus Christ, Inc.

It is not required that you be a member of this church or any other church, to receive Holy Communion at / or with Ray Of Hope Church.

This Holy Communion is the Table of Jesus Christ, who is really present among us. Jesus invites you to receive Him in this Eucharistic banquet. If this is your first time receiving The Blessed Sacrament, let us know before you receive or right after, so we might pray a special prayer of thanksgiving with you.

Unfortunately, through the centuries many institutional churches have established rules, teachings, and practices that would exclude people from Holy Communion. There has been an almost endless list of reasons to exclude people from the Blessed Sacrament. Yet, together, during the worship service, we recite the very words of Jesus, the Words of Institution, "This is my body. This is my blood," and we rehear Christ present with us saying: "Take this, all of you and eat; Take this all of you and drink" of this gift.

I have thought about this extensively and have decided to take these words "Take this, all of you.." as a command to the church to give, and bring, the Eucharistic Gift to everyone who will receive. This approach also requires us to teach people about this gift. I have stated in other places, it is uniquely and deliberately the work of Christ in His Church to offer the necessary education, guidance, and practices that help people live a life centered and purposed on finding and sharing the Will of God. The Lord's Table is central in that life.

The Eucharist belongs to the Church. The Blessed Sacrament is Christ in us, through us, and with us; made known in the breaking of the Bread of Life and drinking of the Cup of Salvation. We are to take this gift to the whole world.

We begin by inviting those who are on the fringe of Society, those who have been pushed aside, those who are poor, who are not accepted, who are sick, who need God's help in special ways. We welcome and bring the Eucharist to everyone who has been told they cannot receive it by other Denominations. In conclusion, to all persons who have ever been told "no you cannot" go to
