+ The Candle Of Hope



Jesus said: (John 5:25 and Titus 2:13)

ALL: "I am the resurrection and the life. Those who believe in me, even though they die, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die." (John 11:25, 26)

Leader -2: In 1983, Ray Of Hope Church was started in part to form a unique ministry to persons affected by and infected with HIV and AIDS and to extend a radical welcome to all people to worship with us. Our witness to God's unconditional love for everyone is as relevant today as in 1983. Here we are forty-one years later, and still, some churches, religions, and, yes, even some countries continue rejecting the sick, lonely, and dying people with HIV and AIDS who deserve comfort and spiritual guidance.

Therefore, at Ray Of Hope Church Of Our Lord Jesus Christ, we continue to read aloud over **110,000** names sewn into the AIDS Memorial Quilt to keep HIV/AIDS in the conscious prayers of people. Scroll the page to see






There is a time for sowing and a time for harvesting, as our first song reminded us. This year, we did not sow bulbs and seeds in the front or side gardens. The result has been as expected: fewer flowers and more weeds. We did not invest the time and energy it would have required to make a beautiful garden as it has been in the past.

B Page 20 of 40 Of course, we also see in verses such as these the idea of investing and sowing to establish, build, and ultimately pass on a ministry to the Word of God and the Sacraments, the community of the beloved people: the Church. There are promises to provide everything the sower needs, and even a surplus, directly from God. God will not be outdone in generosity but will reward the generous with even more grace and financial support.

You are exceedingly generous and steady in supporting Ray Of Hope Church Of Our Lord Jesus Christ, Inc. You do not need to support this ministry to have Paradise, or Heaven opened to you. The eternal Grace of God secures Your Salvation, made known to us in Christ, our Lord and Saviour. I have noticed some people find the subjects of financial support and the Church to be disconnected, at odds with each other, or almost in the shadows of shame. Today's readings I selected clarify the doctrine of maintaining the financial support that allows the organized Church to be in the world but not of the world.

From the Gospel reading, it is evident that women and men supported the ministry of Jesus. Women were important in every aspect of the public and private life of Jesus, even in the hours of his death and resurrection. Women have been the heartbeat of the people in the Church since the first day. Beginning with Moses and the new ministry of worship that developed, starting with the moveable worship space called the Tabernacle to the building of Temples in Jerusalem, to the building of Churches all over the world, God has determined and put into the hearts of people the desire to joyfully and faithfully support the people who do all the background work providing liturgical worship.

No conflict is outlined in the Scriptures between financial support, joyful charitable giving, and the Church. Scripture takes the opposite approach, and we are encouraged to give and support ministry as part of our expression of praise, worship of God, and service to God's people.

You have raised almost \$3,000.00 in just over two weeks by donating extra to the unexpected boiler repairs. The donations for this project continue to come in, and we all want to express our thanks and gratitude to everyone who has helped us over this hurdle. Thank you, thank you. Be sure to thank each person because there are many ways that people have supported this ministry, such as time, talent, skill, hours working on paperwork, legal work, rehearsals, research, paying down an upside-down mortgage, praying for people's intentions, visiting the sick, listening to people share their difficulties, and so much more. You sow lavishly in God's garden, and you can expect an increase due to your trust in God's promises. Dear Friends and Members,

This is the 3rd and hopefully final update regarding the boiler repair needs at the church and monastery. The initial parts were ordered and as the Isaac's technicians were on site to install, they discovered that the original exhaust pipe system was installed incorrectly. They found that the protection grate on the exhaust pipe had been vandalized and that if people have been stuffing things in the pipe this would help explain the cause of the system overheating and destroying the furnace. Additionally, we have known that a bolt was broken off by the last technician from the previous company. He promised to return to fix it and after many attempts we were unsuccessful in getting him to return. We now understand the broken bolt was the primary cause of the Carbon Monoxide leaking, and the stuffing items into the exhaust pipe a secondary cause. The Isaac's technician said that "because of the carbon monoxide leaking", it could have fatally harmed those in the monastery. As a result of the placement of the air intake and the exhaust pipes not being seven feet up from the ground as required, the entire piping exhaust system must be re-designed to to meet that requirement, and new grate on the end of new pipes to prevent someone from breaking into it and stuffing things in it. The new pipes will be placed as high up as possible and be twelve feet under the windows above as required by Code. This will require a ladder to reach and not be at ankle height where they are currently installed. The additional cost of these corrections is \$2,373.97 bringing the final total to \$7,624.00 inclusive of a \$310 service call.

There have already been several major donations given towards this emergency repair and we give God thanks and praise for the generosity and support of our friends and members. We are currently \$2000 short of being able to pay for the repair in full and are asking for any additional donations that can be given at this time. The Council is working through a few scenarios to come up with payment options and we wanted to share this with you now for your thoughts and consideration as well.

The chapel was 54 degrees and frigid inside this morning and we want to do everything we can to keep the doors open to all as long as we can without putting anyone in a very uncomfortable environment due to the internal temperature while the boiler remains off line.

The individuals that live in the monastery have already made financial contributions for which we are very grateful and will continue to do so. We need your support as well as anyone you know who would be inclined to make a tax deductible donation to a charitable organization for a good cause. Help us to keep the building open and the environment safe for all. Any amount given will be of great support.

After these were paid the ending balance of this account at the end of the month was \$1,016.27. Undeposited funds went into this account 10/3 of 122.66.

Building Fund opening balance was \$1,341.34. Donations to the Building Fund were as follows: Brother Shawn Benedict \$700.00, Kaiden Benedict \$400.00 and transferred in \$200 from the General Fund. Regular bills that came out of the fund this month was the Credit Card bill with Key Bank of \$62.01, electric \$233.92, gas bill \$253.00, transferred \$450.00 for Cyrus as stated above and the original check of \$200.00 for the Children's Choir was written from this account. I also transferred \$200.00 into savings to save for the liability insurance bill that will be due the beginning of December. Ending balance of this fund was \$1,242.41.

Building Improvement Fund opening balance on this account was \$2,452.49. Donations to this account for this month were as follows: Ian and Christina \$436.50 the beginning of September, Lisa Frost \$1,000.00, Ed & Phyl Askins \$500.00 and Evan & Kate Hansen \$500.00. The ending balance on this account is \$4,888.99. Undeposited funds went into this account on 10/3 of \$627.34 from Ian and Christina.

Savings (Council) Account opening balance \$43.65. I transferred in \$200.00 from the building to cover the upcoming liability insurance payment, so the ending balance in this account is \$243.65.

These balances do equal the ending bank balances.
