Leader -2: In 1983, Ray Of Hope Church was started in part to form a unique ministry to persons affected by and infected with HIV and AIDS and

to extend a radical welcome to all people to worship with us. Our witness to God's unconditional love for everyone is as relevant today as in 1983. 






The readings we shared today are on the International schedule of Scripture readings known as The Lectionary.

Next Sunday, when we meet, it will already be November 3, 2024, having passed over the 41st Anniversary of the beginning of Ray Of Hope Church Of Our Lord Jesus Christ, Inc.'s 42nd year of ministry.

Last Sunday, October 20, 2024, we read from the Book Ecclesiastes, Chapter 3, verses 1-13.

There is a time for everything in this Universe. Comment on using "season" rather than a "time" for everything.

We continue our celebration today, saying there is a time to be Appreciative, Grateful, and Thankful. Last Sunday, we talked about expressing our thanks and gratitude to everyone who has helped us over this hurdle of the boiler repairs. Thank you, thank you, thank you. Be sure to thank each person because there are many ways that people have supported this ministry over forty-one years, such as time, talent, skill, hours working on paperwork, legal work, rehearsals, research, paying down an upside-down mortgage, praying for people's intentions, visiting the sick, listening to people share their difficulties, accompanying people in their last minutes of life to their last breath, and so much more. You people of Ray Of Hope sow the seeds of the Word of God lavishly in God's garden, and you can expect an increase due to your trust in God's promises. We are here by the grace of God and the generosity of the people who see to it that we pay our bills and take care of God's property, seen and unseen.

You are a wonderful, beautiful, and generous people, and I hope you appreciate one another.

The actual date of our founding is October 31st, 1983, late in the evening at the Northeast District Conference of the Metropolitan Community Church. Did the people at the Northeast District Conference plan to have the vote after sunset? We do not know, but we are pleased it happened this way. You see, in the Bible and therefore in the Church, the new day begins at sunset, not at midnight, but at sunset, the early morning of the new day begins. So, Ray Of

Hope was officially started in the early morning of All Saints Day, or, as also known, on All Hallows Eve, the evening before All Saints' Day, All Hallows Day. It is also a three-day celebration known as Allhallowtide, including the day before, the day, and the day after All Saints Day. It does not require much imagination to understand how often the celebration the night before All Saints Day emphasizes the opposite of the meaning of the Resurrection that God has predestined for all people who have ever lived in any age and from anywhere.

Proclaiming the Doctrine there is no separation between the love of God and the People is the theme, the motto, the purpose of Ray Of Hope Church Of Our Lord Jesus Christ, Inc., and to welcome everyone just as God in Christ has welcomed us.

You are as welcome here as Jesus Christ Himself.
In Romans 15:7 the Scriptures exhort us to:
"Welcome one another, then, as Christ welcomed you,
for the glory of God" (NABRE - 2011)

All saints, all people, and all of creation are welcomed in this place, for this place belongs to the God of all creation, and we have been fortunate to understand the Living, Loving, Good, and Gracious God through Jesus Christ, God's Only Begotten Son, our Lord, and Saviour.

Regarding today's readings:

In the first reading, Jeremiah 31:7-9, we begin the subject of eschatology, which is the study of the final events of this age. In this reading, as well as many over the next eight weeks, we read the prophecy that all of the People of Israel, the Jewish people, will be gathered from all over the World into the Country of Israel. There is another World War in Prophecy yet to be fought, and I am not speaking of the Battle of Armageddon. Another war will involve a united effort by China, Russia, and the Persian Countries to the north of Israel as they will all come against Israel. Notice how the Western Nations are becoming a little impatient with Israel and even blaming the current Government of Israel for some of the hostilities that are growing in our day. One thing that happened this week moved us closer to the correct alliance of Nations for this war: North Korea sent 12,000 troops to the front between Russia and Ukraine. The United States warned that these soldiers would be considered targets as though they were Russians. Anyone can see how this might pull us deeper into this conflict. (more information

https://www.nbcnews.com/news/world/north-korean-troops-russia-ukraine-fair-game-us-putin-rcna176989) Then, of course, the exchange of missiles between Iran and Israel also brings us closer to this war prophesied in Ezekiel Chapters 38 and 39, that has not been fought yet and will precede the Messianic Kingdom. The exact alliance of nations for this predicted war has not yet formed. However, nothing will stop the fact that Israel will be home to the Jewish messiah king, whom we understand to be Jesus at His Second Coming.

Our response to Psalm 126, "The Lord has done great things for us; we are filled with joy," celebrates the times when Israel was in bondage to other Countries, including Egypt, Assyria, Persia, Babylon, Greece, Roman occupation, and dispersion among the Nations, persecution by Western Nations - namely Germany, God has rescued them, God will continue to rescue Israel and fulfill all of the promises to Israel. We also see in Psalm 126 our own Joy as we await the fulfillment of all these promises, including the Second Coming of Christ Our Lord.

The second reading, Hebrews 5:1-6, is part of a more extended section explaining that the crucified, risen, and ascended Christ is serving us as our High Priest at the right hand of God during this Church Age. At the right

hand of God, Christ offers himself so that sins may be forgiven in His Name here on earth, through His body, the Church.

In today's Gospel, Mark 10:46-52, Jesus shows that he is who he says he is, with gifts of healing and resurrection. We also have come to understand the insight the Holy Spirit gives us as we seek to understand the past, the present, and the future we live in. We also understand the Holy Spirit waits for us to ask for wisdom and insight; the Spirit opens the door to the Divine Wisdom to anyone who asks. The blindness caused by the doctrines of the World, including violence, power, war, and fear of death, is healed, and Christ opens our eyes. Now, we understand the Word of God, and we understand Christ in the past, Christ in the present, and Christ in the future. We see the following Scriptures in their fulfillment.

Isaiah 25:7, ⁷ The Lord will destroy on this mountain the shroud that is cast over all peoples, the sheet that is spread over all nations;

8 he will swallow up death forever.

with

Hebrews 2:14 and 15 ¹⁴ Inasmuch then as the children have partaken of flesh and blood, He Himself likewise shared in the same, that through death He might destroy him who had the power of death, that is, the devil, ¹⁵ and release those who through fear of death were all their lifetime subject to bondage.

with

1 Corinthians 15:26 The last enemy that shall be destroyed is death.

Romans 14:8,9 If we live, it is for the Lord that we live, and if we die, it is for the Lord that we die. So whether we live or die, we belong to the Lord. For Christ died and rose to life in order to be the Lord of the living and of the dead. Good News Translation



Dear Friends and Members,

This is the 3rd and hopefully final update regarding the boiler repair needs at the church and monastery. The initial parts were ordered and as the Isaac's technicians were on site to install, they discovered that the original exhaust pipe system was installed incorrectly. They found that the protection grate on the exhaust pipe had been vandalized and that if people have been stuffing things in the pipe this would help explain the cause of the system overheating and destroying the furnace. Additionally, we have known that a bolt was broken off by the last technician from the previous company. He promised to return to fix it and after many attempts we were unsuccessful in getting him to return. We now understand the broken bolt was the primary cause of the Carbon Monoxide leaking, and the stuffing items into the exhaust pipe a secondary cause. The Isaac's technician said that "because of the carbon monoxide leaking", it could have fatally harmed those in the monastery. As a result of the placement of the air intake and the exhaust pipes not being seven feet up from the ground as required, the entire piping exhaust system must be re-designed to to meet that requirement, and new grate on the end of new pipes to prevent someone from breaking into it and stuffing things in it. The new pipes will be placed as high up as possible and be twelve feet under the windows above as required by Code. This will require a ladder to reach and not be at ankle height where they are currently installed. The additional cost of these corrections is \$2,373.97 bringing the final total to \$7,624.00 inclusive of a \$310 service call.

There have already been several major donations given towards this emergency repair and we give God thanks and praise for the generosity and support of our friends and members. We are currently \$2000 short of being able to pay for the repair in full and are asking for any additional donations that can be given at this time. The Council is working through a few scenarios to come up with payment options and we wanted to share this with you now for your thoughts and consideration as well.

The chapel was 54 degrees and frigid inside this morning and we want to do everything we can to keep the doors open to all as long as we can without putting anyone in a very uncomfortable environment due to the internal temperature while the boiler remains off line.

The individuals that live in the monastery have already made financial contributions for which we are very grateful and will continue to do so. We need your support as well as anyone you know who would be inclined to make a tax deductible donation to a charitable organization for a good cause. Help us to keep the building open and the environment safe for all. Any amount given will be of great support.

Treasurer's Report for the month of September 2024.

General Fund opening balance at the beginning of the month of September, 2024 was \$265.34. Donations to the General Fund for the month were \$3,008.50. Pastoral compensation of \$495.00 per week for 4 week was paid, Verizon \$62.13. Children's Choir reimbursement to the building fund was done of \$200.00, Cyrus bill for annual web hosting of \$450.00 and Paypal charges of \$15.44 came out of this account. After these were paid the ending balance of this account at the end of the month was \$1,016.27. Undeposited funds went into this account 10/3 of 122.66.

Building Fund opening balance was \$1,341.34. Donations to the Building Fund were as follows: Brother Shawn Benedict \$700.00, Kaiden Benedict \$400.00 and transferred in \$200 from the General Fund. Regular bills that came out of the fund this month was the Credit Card bill with Key Bank of \$62.01, electric \$233.92, gas bill \$253.00, transferred \$450.00 for Cyrus as stated above and the original check of \$200.00 for the Children's Choir was written from this account. I also transferred \$200.00 into savings to save for the liability insurance bill that will be due the beginning of December. Ending balance of this fund was \$1,242.41.

Building Improvement Fund opening balance on this account was \$2,452.49. Donations to this account for this month were as follows: Ian and Christina \$436.50 the beginning of September, Lisa Frost \$1,000.00, Ed & Phyl Askins \$500.00 and Evan & Kate Hansen \$500.00. The ending balance on this account is \$4,888.99. Undeposited funds went into this account on 10/3 of \$627.34 from Ian and Christina.

Savings (Council) Account opening balance \$43.65. I transferred in \$200.00 from the building to cover the upcoming liability insurance payment, so the ending balance in this account is \$243.65.

These balances do equal the ending bank balances.

This report was given at the October 22 meeting of the Council by Mr. Edward Askins, Council Treasurer.
