




We are celebrating Gratitude, Appreciation, and Thankfulness for 41 years of ministry welcoming all people to the free gift of salvation.

Two weeks ago, Sunday, October 20, 2024, we read from the Book Ecclesiastes, Chapter 3, verses 1-13.

There is a time or a season for everything in this Universe.

Last Sunday, October 27, 2024, we said we were continuing the celebration as we are again today, saying there is a time to be Appreciative, Grateful, and Thankful. Be sure to thank each person because there are many ways that people have supported this ministry over forty-one years, such as time, talent, skill, hours working on paperwork, legal work, rehearsals, research, paying down an upside-down mortgage, praying for people's intentions, visiting the sick, listening to people share their difficulties, accompanying people in their last minutes of life to their last breath, and so much more. I stand by my

B Page 21 of 48 statement from last week when I said the people of Ray Of Hope sow the seeds of the Word of God lavishly in God's garden and can expect a lavish response from God because we trust in God's promises. We are here by the grace, the kindness, the goodness of God, and the generosity of the people who see that we pay our bills and care for God's property, seen and unseen.

The phrase "seen and unseen" is poetic for many people. It is a phrase in a frequently used version of the Nicene Creed:

"We believe in One God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is seen and unseen."

When I say, "We are here by the grace, the kindness, the goodness of God, and the generosity of the people - I could add people "seen and unseen" who see to it that we pay our bills and take care of God's property, "seen and unseen." All things belong to Christ in God, all things, "seen and unseen."

You are a wonderful, beautiful, and generous people, and I hope you appreciate one another.

The actual date of our founding is October 31st, 1983, late in the evening. Last Sunday, I remembered how Ray Of Hope officially started in the early morning of All Saints Day or on All Hallows Eve, the evening before All Saints' Day, All Hallows Day. It is also a three-day celebration known as Allhallowtide, including the day before, the day, and the day after All Saints Day. I also failed to recall that October 31 is officially Reformation Day. On October 31, 1519, Professor, Rev. Martin Luther, posted, or nailed his "Ninety-five Theses" to the door of the church in Wittenberg that happens to be named, All Saints' Church.

As with so many other celebrated events and customs, this event of Rev. Luther nailing the document to the church door has been challenged as to its historicity. The day is undoubtedly celebrated as the start of the Reformation period. (source: article Reformation https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Reformation_Day)

Bringing it all together then, Forty-one years ago, this Congregation was permitted to officially identify as Ray Of Hope Church on "All Hallows Eve," the early morning hours of The Feast of All Saints, on the 31st of October,

The only days I could consider more fitting would be Pentecost, Christmas, or Resurrection Sunday. You and I have come into a community of Saints that was intentionally started to proclaim the Love of God outpoured on everyone in every time and every place through the reality of sending the Only Begotten Son of God, Christ Jesus.

In the song we sang last week, "Come With Me Into the Fields," the verse reads;

None of us attended the first meeting of Ray Of Hope in July of 1983 when Mr. Ted Ewald held the first meeting, which fourteen people attended. (http://www.rayofhopechurch.com/shorthist.htm) I joined on September 5, 1993, thirty-one years ago, when the Congregation was in its tenth year. The seeds of Faith in the power of the Holy Word of God that were sown "by other hands" than ours have been nurtured, cared for, and they continue to grow.

In the first reading today, John can see into Heaven, where he witnesses people from every nation under the heavens. This vision he sees tells us a truth that is often not taught: God so loved the world that God saved humanity through Christ.

In the second reading, we are called members of the household of God, saints, and citizens.

In the Gospel we have "The Beatitudes" as commonly referred to. Sometimes when these proverbs and promises are taught to children, we call them "Be" attitudes, emphasizing that we should become each of these attitudes.

Ray Of Hope started in response to years of persecution aimed at people who experience attraction, desire, comfort, emotional connection, spiritual connection with other people who are in one or many ways outside the scope of a construct of behavioral boundaries known as "Christian, Biblical, Traditional heteronormative sexual orientation." What we find in Scripture is the full spectrum of sexual orientation and even gender expressions that do include what we call "straight" but also include polyamorous, same-gender loving, divorced and remarried, divorced, single, asexual, and almost any modern expression of personhood we find today. It can even be argued that the Law of Moses allowed what we identify today as surrogacy. Church leadership knows these are factual statements. However, most clergy have their hands tied tightly to denominational dogmatic and teaching decisions set by others outside the "pay scale" of pastoral care that keep the pastors' tongues clinging to the roof of their mouths (see Psalm 137:6).

It's okay to say "gay" here and every other variously defined word of the colorful stain-glass window of the human rainbow. It is all God's doing from start to end.

Dear Friends and Members.

This is the 3rd and hopefully final update regarding the boiler repair needs at the church and monastery. The initial parts were ordered and as the Isaac's technicians were on site to install, they discovered that the original exhaust pipe system was installed incorrectly. They found that the protection grate on the exhaust pipe had been vandalized and that if people have been stuffing things in the pipe this would help explain the cause of the system overheating and destroying the furnace. Additionally, we have known that a bolt was broken off by the last technician from the previous company. He promised to return to fix it and after many attempts we were unsuccessful in getting him to return. We now understand the broken bolt was the primary cause of the Carbon Monoxide leaking, and the stuffing items into the exhaust pipe a secondary cause. The Isaac's technician said that "because of the carbon monoxide leaking", it could have fatally harmed those in the monastery. As a result of the placement of the air intake and the exhaust pipes not being seven feet up from the ground as required, the entire piping exhaust system must be re-designed to to meet that requirement, and new grate on the end of new pipes to prevent someone from breaking into it and stuffing things in it. The new pipes will be placed as high up as possible and be twelve feet under the windows above as required by Code. This will require a ladder to reach and not be at ankle height where they are currently installed. The additional cost of these corrections is \$2.373.97 bringing the final total to \$7.624.00 inclusive of a \$310 service call.

There have already been several major donations given towards this emergency repair and we give God thanks and praise for the generosity and support of our friends and members. We are currently \$2000 short of being able to pay for the repair in full and are asking for any additional donations that can be given at this time. The Council is working through a few scenarios to come up with payment options and we wanted to share this with you now for your thoughts and consideration as well.

The chapel was 54 degrees and frigid inside this morning and we want to do everything we can to keep the doors open to all as long as we can without putting anyone in a very uncomfortable environment due to the internal temperature while the boiler remains off line.

The individuals that live in the monastery have already made financial contributions for which we are very grateful and will continue to do so. We need your support as well as anyone you know who would be inclined to make a tax deductible donation to a charitable organization for a good cause. Help us to keep the building open and the environment safe for all. Any amount given will be of great support.

Treasurer's Report for the month of September 2024.

General Fund opening balance at the beginning of the month of September, 2024 was \$265.34. Donations to the General Fund for the month were \$3,008.50. Pastoral compensation of \$495.00 per week for 4 week was paid, Verizon \$62.13. Children's Choir reimbursement to the building fund was done of \$200.00, Cyrus bill for annual web hosting of \$450.00 and Paypal charges of \$15.44 came out of this account. After these were paid the ending balance of this account at the end of the month was \$1,016.27. Undeposited funds went into this account 10/3 of 122.66.

Building Fund opening balance was \$1,341.34. Donations to the Building Fund were as follows: Brother Shawn Benedict \$700.00, Kaiden Benedict \$400.00 and transferred in \$200 from the General Fund. Regular bills that came out of the fund this month was the Credit Card bill with Key Bank of \$62.01, electric \$233.92, gas bill \$253.00, transferred \$450.00 for Cyrus as stated above and the original check of \$200.00 for the Children's Choir was written from this account. I also transferred \$200.00 into savings to save for the liability insurance bill that will be due the beginning of December. Ending balance of this fund was \$1,242.41.

Building Improvement Fund opening balance on this account was \$2,452.49. Donations to this account for this month were as follows: Ian and Christina \$436.50 the beginning of September, Lisa Frost \$1,000.00, Ed & Phyl Askins \$500.00 and Evan & Kate Hansen \$500.00. The ending balance on this account is \$4,888.99. Undeposited funds went into this account on 10/3 of \$627.34 from Ian and Christina.

Savings (Council) Account opening balance \$43.65. I transferred in \$200.00 from the building to cover the upcoming liability insurance payment, so the ending balance in this account is \$243.65.

These balances do equal the ending bank balances.

This report was given at the October 22 meeting of the Council by Mr. Edward Askins, Council Treasurer.


