We also honor our Veterans today and tomorrow, Monday, November 11, 2024, Veterans Day. The first celebration of Veterans Day was held in 1947, organized by World War II Veteran Raymond Weeks on Armistice Day, when the fighting of World War I ended at 11:00 a.m., on November 11, 1918 (the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month). In 1954, Congress passed the bill to change the name to Veterans Day, and President Eisenhower signed it, proclaiming November 11 as Veterans Day. 






TEXT OF PROPOSAL NUMBER ONE, AN AMENDMENT CONCURRENT RESOLUTION OF THE SENATE AND ASSEMBLY

proposing an amendment to section 11 of article 1 of the constitution, in relation to equal protection

Section 1. Resolved (if the Assembly concur), That section 11 of article 1 of the constitution be amended to read as follows:

§ 11. <u>a.</u> No person shall be denied the equal protection of the laws of this state or any subdivision thereof. No person shall, because of race, color, <u>ethnicity, national origin, age, disability</u>, creed [or], religion, <u>or sex, including</u> <u>sexual orientation, gender identity, gender expression, pregnancy, pregnancy</u> <u>outcomes, and reproductive healthcare and autonomy</u>, be subjected to any discrimination in [his or her] <u>their</u> civil rights by any other person or by any firm, corporation, or institution, or by the state or any agency or subdivision of the state, <u>pursuant to law</u>.

Dear Saints,

The Lord is with you!

Here is an update on my pastoral letter from November 6, 2024. As of this morning, Saturday, November 9, 2024, at 10:30 a.m., 89.6 percent of 161.42 million registered voters participated in the November 5th election.

Fortunately, 43.6 percent of registered voters in the USA 70,357,568 (47.9% of those who voted) did vote in line with the principles in our Statement of Purpose.

As of today, <mark>46 percent</mark> of registered voters, <mark>74,264,589 (50.5% of those who voted),</mark> won the election and rejected some of the principles aligned with our Statement of Purpose.

Additionally, 10.4 percent, or 16,797,843 registered voters, did not vote in this election, a large number of people who perhaps believe their vote does not count.

We are fortunate to be accompanied by 70.5 million people on "our journey into renewal, fresh beginnings, new possibilities, and a renewed embrace of our potential" as we pray at the end of the Ray Of Hope Church Sunday Liturgy. We have 90 million people, approximately **91,062,432**, or about 56.4 percent of registered voters, as our mission field, starting with our next-door or downstairs neighbors, co-workers, friends, and families. The heroic mission work is all around us. The harvest is plenty; the seeds are ready to be sown; some that were sown need a fresh drink of the water of the Holy Spirit, and some need some loving care. We know how to do this work, and we understand the message that is needed.

Remember, Scripture exhorts us to:

¹⁶ Rejoice always, ¹⁷ pray without ceasing, ¹⁸ give thanks in all circumstances, for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you. ¹⁹ Do not quench the Spirit. ²⁰ Do not despise prophecies, ²¹ but test everything; hold fast to what is good; ²² abstain from every form of evil. (1 Thessalonians 5:14-24)

In addition to the 70.5 million people who voted for equality and liberty for all people at the National level, we are very grateful for the passage of Proposal 1 in New York State, amending the New York State Constitution to expand antidiscrimination and equal protection rights to include ethnicity, national origin, age, disability, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity and expression, pregnancy outcomes, and reproductive health care. Proposal 1 aligns the New York State Constitution more with the Ray Of Hope <u>Statement of Purpose</u>.

The Church is to be present in the world until Christ returns. On the night of his betrayal, Jesus prayed in the Garden of Gethsemane: "Holy Father" (John 17:11)

^{"14} I have given them Your word; and the world has hated them because they are not of the world, just as I am not of the world. ¹⁵ I do not pray that You should take them out of the world, but that You should keep them from the evil one. ¹⁶ They are not of the world, just as I am not of the world. ¹⁷ Sanctify^[I] them by Your truth. Your word is truth. ¹⁸ As You sent Me into the world, I also have sent them into the world." (John 17:14-18)

Saints, we are called to be in the world. We know the world system is not motivated to give honor and glory to God, in Christ, and through the working of the Holy Spirit. The goals of the Republican Party, as expressed in Project 2025, and many words that the President-Elect and Vice President-Elect have publically spoken in the last two months have won the support of 50.5% of those who voted on November 5, 2024.

I have warned for all the twenty-eight years that you have elected me to serve as your Appointed Pastor, that Postmillennial Theology in its new form that began to take shape in the 1930s but crystallized in the mid-1970s, known today as Reconstructionist postmillennialism, Christian Theonomy, Christian Nationalism, Dominion Theology, Christian Reconstructionism (see: <u>https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Postmillennialism</u>), and most recently the NEW APOSTOLIC REFORMATION

(<u>https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/New_Apostolic_Reformation</u>), with its Seven Mountain Mandate (<u>https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Seven_Mountain_Mandate</u>) would eventually prevail as it has in this election, and will now be used to attempt to govern our Country. Speaker of the House of Representatives Mike Johnson is a prominent participant and leader in this movement. Judges and even Supreme Court Judges participate in the postmillennial movement (as identified by one or all of the names listed above). The laypeople and clergy in this "Conservative" Theological/political movement are welleducated in its principles. They have won this election, period.

As your Pastor, I will increase my efforts to educate you in a more healthy and honest Theology and give you the tools to inform those who have fallen victim to the idea that being nice, honest, and secular is where leadership will prevail against the current dominant system.

It is Christ's will that we are in the world but not of the world, and we must follow His example and leadership on how to do that. In closing, the Scriptures exhort us:

⁹ So let us not grow weary in doing what is right, for we will reap at harvest time, if we do not give up. ¹⁰ So then, whenever we have an opportunity, let us work for the good of all and especially for those of the family of faith. (Galatians 6:9-10)

This morning, we are very grateful Ray Of Hope Church Of Our Lord Jesus Christ, Inc. is here, present, and ready to serve. Take time to appreciate each other and to be thankful for each person who steps up and stands tall for this Gospel of Christ we have been called to proclaim. You are a wonderful, special, generous, and faithful Congregation of Christ Jesus, Our Lord. The Lord is with you, and we will stand up and be counted with Jesus for the Love of God and equality for all.

(https://www.cityandstateny.com/policy/2024/10/prop-1-explained-painstakingdetail/400663/) In both the first reading and the Gospel reading we discern the Doctrine that when we are poor in spirit, not haughty, but giving and trusting in God's presence; we will always be sustained by the eternal creating strength of God. Though the widow could see she barely had enough flour and oil to feed herself and her son, she obeyed the voice of God made known through the Prophet Elijah and made bread for her guest. What happened then? God continued to provide for all of them for many days.

1 Kings 17 ¹⁵ She went away and did what Elijah told her to do. And there was food every day for Elijah and for the woman and her family. ¹⁶ The jar of flour was not used up and the jug of oil did not run dry, in keeping with the word of God spoken by Elijah.

Likewise, when Jesus saw a poor elderly trusting in God by giving her gift, though she had nothing extra, he saw her heart, he saw her spirit, he saw her deep love and trust that God would provide.

Mark 12: ⁴¹ Jesus sat down opposite the collection box and watched the people putting money in it, and many of the rich put in a great deal. ⁴² A poor widow came and put in two small coins, the equivalent of a penny. ⁴³ Then Jesus called out to the disciples and said to them, "The truth is, this woman has put in more than all who have contributed to the treasury; ⁴⁴ for they have put in money from their surplus, but she has put in everything she possessed from the little she had—all she had to live on."

Book of Hebrews chapter 9, verses 24-28.

The reading is on page 224 in the second testament, in the back of the NRSV Bible. I will be reading from The Inclusive Bible Version Here begins the reading.

²⁴ For Christ didn't go into a holy place made by human hands, a copy of the real one. Christ went into heaven itself and now appears on our behalf in the presence of God. ²⁵ High priests of old went into the Most Holy Place every year with the blood of an animal. But <u>Christ didn't make a self-offering more than that one time; ²⁶</u>

otherwise, Christ would have had to suffer many times ever since the creation of the world. But now that the Consummation is upon us, Christ has appeared once and for all, to remove sin through self-sacrifice.²⁷ It is appointed that everyone must die once and then be judged by God.²⁸ In the same way, <u>Christ was offered</u> once to bear the sins of many, and then will appear a second time—not to deal with sin, but to save those who are waiting for Christ's appearing.

We have what little we have by the Grace and will of God. We are inspired to invest ourselves to the spread of the message of God's radical welcome to all people by the love we experience with God.

In the Gloria we pray: You take away the sin of the world, have mercy on us. This second reading tells us the first appearing of Christ was to "take away the sin of the world." The second appearing of Christ will be to save those who are waiting for His appearing. This event is known as the Blessed Hope, or First Resurrection, and nicknamed the rapture from the Latin version of the verse.



Children's Choir reimbursement to the building fund was done of \$200.00, Cyrus bill for annual web hosting of \$450.00 and Paypal charges of \$15.44 came out of this account. After these were paid the ending balance of this account at the end of the month was \$1,016.27. Undeposited funds went into this account 10/3 of 122.66.

Building Fund opening balance was \$1,341.34. Donations to the Building Fund were as follows: Brother Shawn Benedict \$700.00, Kaiden Benedict \$400.00 and transferred in \$200 from the General Fund. Regular bills that came out of the fund this month was the Credit Card bill with Key Bank of \$62.01, electric \$233.92, gas bill \$253.00, transferred \$450.00 for Cyrus as stated above and the original check of \$200.00 for the Children's Choir was written from this account. I also transferred \$200.00 into savings to save for the liability insurance bill that will be due the beginning of December. Ending balance of this fund was \$1,242.41.






