The bell rings out 39 joyful rings, in contrast to tolling the bell in single rings. The 39 joyful rings honor the 39 lashes Jesus endured, and we now celebrate victory and gratitude for our Salvation. "The chastisement for our peace was upon Him, And by His stripes, we are healed." (Isaiah 53:5) We ring the bell before worship and Bible Enrichment sessions. Listen carefully and see if you can hear all 39 rings.



Many times I have said it is so obvious to me that God gave our community God's own personal insignia, the Rainbow, to fly as our symbol of who we are as a people. Today on this Pride Sunday in the Winter it is a great time to read that sermon / story again. This all became clear to me as I participated in the Pride Parade that featured the one mile long rainbow flag. It happened in 1994 at Stonewall 25. I told the story and put it on our web site in June, 2000. Since that time, Gilbert Baker, the designer / founder of the Pride Flag has passed away, dying on March 31, 2017. Perhaps this weekend as we celebrate Pride in the Winter you might go and read our updated page on the rainbow flag and pass it on to others too. Read it and see the new photos by clicking here.

Gospel: Today's Gospel is a continuation of last Sunday. Here, the ministry of the baptist, John, is one of repentance, which literally means to change direction. The verses in Luke claim John advised everyone to take care of the poor, share the resources, persons in business are told to be honest and fair, those who are soldiers are told not to bully and not use their power to accuse to get ahead falsely, and to the financially powerful he advised, among other things, that they be content. We recognize most of these evangelistic themes because they are as poignant today as they were during any age of the prophets. Sin is old-fashioned and still very prominent in every age. All of these themes are still with us.

When the people attending John's revivals started thinking he might be the Messiah he clarified that he was not. Then, John taught a new doctrine, saying the Messiah would baptize with the Holy Spirit.






