



All of us were known to God before we were in the wombs of our mothers. Jeremiah was a normal human who said "yes" to the call of God. Clearly in the first reading, Jeremiah 1, verse 4, we see God knew Jeremiah before his human life. This brings us back to the three parts of the human person: body, soul, and mind. We all agree on the body being that which is given to us by our father and mother in the womb of our mother. However, the words soul and mind are confusing because some theologies set the "soul" as the part of us that existed before our body, and therefore the mind is part of the human body made in the womb. Other theologies switch and say the mind or spirit is the eternal part and the soul, our feelings come with our bodies in the womb. I think we may all agree that we are one third eternal and two-thirds human creation.

For the purpose of this short sermon, I will use "soul" to refer to our eternal part. God alone can create souls. When God creates a soul, it is forever from that beginning. We all understand our bodies and with them the organ of the brain - the mind, are made on our mother's bodies. What this first reading indicates today is we all have been in creation before we were physically born. The two beautiful gifts promised to each of us are 1) when our body dies we will have the gift of having our souls and spirits united and only leaving the body aside waiting for our return. At a day known only to God, we will return with Christ and receive our resurrection bodies and be united again as Body, Soul, and Spirit but now able to live without any of the destructive powers of Sin.

There is much more to be said about this first reading that has to be addressed on Tuesday evening Bible Enrichment sessions. Included is one of the many places in Scripture God promises the people and land of Israel protection from other countries and other religions attacking them. In verse 19 it is clearly promised; "They will assault you but will never conquer you, for I am with you to deliver you - it is YHWH who speaks." The history of Israel certainly reveals nation after nation trying to destroy them from the face of the Earth, and yet, it is impossible. 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Treasurer's Report for the month of December 2024

General Fund opening balance at the beginning of December was \$849.50. Donations to the General Fund for the month were \$4,058.90. This included special donations of \$400.00 towards Brothers' self-employment tax and a \$200 special donation towards the internet reimbursement. Also, the undeposited funds of \$77.67 from November were deposited in December. Pastoral compensation of \$495.00 per week for 5 weeks was paid equaling \$2,475.00 Verizon \$62.38, Paypal charges of \$70.01 and a reimbursement of \$200 to Brother for the Internet came out of this account. After these were paid the ending balance of this account at the end of the month was \$2,178.68.

The Building Fund opening balance was \$1,209.64. Donations to the Building Fund were as follows: Brother Shawn Benedict \$700.00, Kaiden Benedict \$400.00. Regular bills that came out of the fund this month was the Credit Card bill with Key Bank of \$59.08, electric \$679.15,(this higher amount was to catch us up on the budget balance) gas bill \$253.00, liability insurance \$291.18, a purchase of communion kits for \$30.99 and the water bill of \$92.53. Ending balance of this fund was \$903.71.

Building Improvement Fund opening balance on this account was \$720.63. The undeposited funds of \$500.00 from the end of November were deposited in December bring the ending balance on the account to \$1,220.63

The credit card balance from the latest statement if \$2,476.09. We spent \$433.44 last year on interest on this card.

At the end of 2024 our income exceeded our expenses by \$1,973.60. The members of the council wish to thank the congregation for their generous donations.


