

The Bread Of Life, week 1 of 5

We are continuing in our special series on the story of the Church as seen through the seven letters to the seven churches in the Book of Revelation. Today is the second church stage, The Church of Smyrna the Persecuted Church, years 100 - 312.

Pastor: We begin now to worship God in the beauty of holiness, in spirit, and in truth. (Psalm 96:9; John 4:23-24)

ALL: Together we give God thanks and praise.

FIRST SONG: The Church's One Foundation G&P 573

Leader -1: Please be seated. At this time we light our Resurrection Candle Of Hope. This is a testimony to our anticipation of the resurrection of all the dead, and the transformation of the living faithful, when Christ returns.

ALL: Jesus said: "I am the resurrection and the life. Those who believe in me, even though they die, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die." (John 11:25, 26)

Leader -1: Our faith community is looking forward and waiting "for the blessed hope and the manifestation of the glory of our great God and Saviour, Jesus Christ."(Titus2:13 NRSV) We named this candle the Candle of Hope in honor of the "Blessed Hope," the return of Christ who will raise all to new life. (John 5:25)

Leader -2: Hello. My name is ______ and I am in the City of _____ in the State of ______. It is our custom to read panel entries from the <u>Names Project Aids Memorial Quilt</u> to help us remember those who died of AIDS, especially since many who were very sick and dying were rejected by the churches, were very much alone, and needed spiritual guidance. 
+ Opening Prayer

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Reader: The Gospel reading is on page 97 in the back of the NRSV Bible. The reading is in the Gospel of John, chapter 6, verses 1-15.

July 25, 2021 17th Sunday of the Church Year B page: 8 **Reader:** Truly present among us, the Lord is with you. **ALL:** And also with you.

Reader: A reading of the Holy Gospel according to Mark. ALL: Glory to you, O Lord. May the Word of God be in our (+) minds that we will understand it, on our (+) lips that we will speak it, and in our (+) hearts that we will love it.

6 After this Jesus went to the other side of the Sea of Galilee, also called the Sea of Galilee of Tiberias. ² A large crowd kept following him, because they saw the signs that he was doing for the sick. ³ Jesus went up the mountain and sat down there with his disciples. ⁴ Now the Passover, the festival of the Jews, was near. ⁵ When he looked up and saw a large crowd coming toward him, Jesus said to Philip, "Where are we to buy bread for these people to eat?" ⁶ He said this to test him, for he himself knew what he was going to do. ⁷ Philip answered him, "Six months' wages (two hundred denarii; a denarius was one days's usual wage for labor) would not buy enough bread for each of them to get a little." ⁸ One of his disciples, Andrew, Simon Peter's brother, said to him, ⁹ "There is a boy here who has five barley loaves and two fish. But what are they among so many people?" ¹⁰ Jesus said, "Make the people sit down." Now there was a great deal of grass in the place; so they sat down, about five thousand in all. ¹¹ Then Jesus took the loaves, and when he had given thanks, he distributed them to those who were seated; so also the fish, as much as they wanted. ¹² When they were satisfied, he told his disciples, "Gather up the fragments left over, so that nothing may be lost." ¹³ So they gathered them up, and from the fragments of the five barley loaves, left by those who had eaten, they filled twelve baskets. ¹⁴ When the people saw the sign that he had done, they began to say, "This is indeed the prophet who is to come into the world."

July 25, 2021 17th Sunday of the Church Year B page: 9 ¹⁵ When Jesus realized that they were about to come and take him by force to make him king, he withdrew again to the mountain by himself.

Reader: This is the Gospel of the Lord! ALL: Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ!

Gospel Acclamation



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+ Thoughts on Today's Gospel.

Today is the first of five Sundays we slowly read and study through the sixth chapter of John. THE BREAD OF LIFE.

In John 6, verse 6 (the number of humanity), Jesus tests Phillip and the others for "he himself knew what he was going to do." Jesus said, "Make the people sit down." Now there was a great deal of grass in the place, so they sat down, about five thousand in all. Note: the Apostles and Disciples organize.

6:7 Philip answered him, "Six months' wages (two hundred denarii; a denarius was one days' usual wage for labor) would not buy enough bread for each of them to get a little." **8 STRESS IS GETTING TO THEM!**

Jesus receives the gifts of bread and fish. Jesus blesses it, breaks it, and gives it to the Apostles and Disciples to distribute. This is a Eucharistic moment and sets the format for the future liturgy of the Eucharist. Notice, they did not waste any food. The large crowd did not leave the gathering with food, papers, cups, and junk all over the place like we leave popular gatherings and events today. The food is reverenced and consumed in this passage. They gathered the extra food for distribution later. FOOD ECOLOGY IS HOLY. Stop throwing food in the trash, plastic in the ocean, etc.

Notice when what they have is shared; it is multiplied, there is plenty for all and plenty for later. "There is always a place for guests at our table." Notice, Jesus is receiving the stranger. Everyone is welcomed to Jesus' Table.

In John 6:14, the people say: "This is indeed the prophet who is to come into the world."

Notice they identify Jesus as "the prophet," not just any prophet, or not just another prophet but "the prophet."

In Deuteronomy 18:15, Moses prophesied: **15** "The Lord your God will raise up for you a Prophet like me from your midst, from your brethren. Him you shall hear,..." This promise set off a constant search for THIS prophet. The people of John 6:14 were likely identifying Jesus as the one they had been anticipating. Identifying Jesus as this prophet had already happened as recorded in John 1:45 **45** Philip found Nathanael and said to him, "We have found Him of whom Moses in the law, and also the prophets, wrote—Jesus of Nazareth, the son of Joseph."

However, when the ideas of satan get into their heads, they want to keep Jesus as their own. They want to make him a material-producing king! Sound familiar? Lucifer tempted Adam and Eve similarly. He also tempted Jesus with material power when Jesus was in the desert. This is "the synagogue or religion or school of satan." See below in our series notes.

+ Second Reading

July 25, 2021 17th Sunday of the Church Year B page: 11 **Reader:** Hello. My name is ______ and I am in the City of ______ in the State of ______. The second reading is in the Book of Revelation chapter 2, verses 8-11. Here begins the reading:

2 "To the angel (messenger) of the church of Smyrna write,

'These things says the First and the Last, who was dead, and came to life: ⁹ "I know your works, tribulation, and poverty (but you are rich); and *I know* the blasphemy of those who say they are Jews and are not, but *are* a ^[b]synagogue of Satan. ¹⁰ Do not fear any of those things which you are about to suffer. Indeed, the devil is about to throw *some* of you into prison, that you may be tested, and you will have tribulation ten days. Be faithful until death, and I will give you the crown of life.

¹¹ "He who has an ear, let him hear what the Spirit says to the churches. He who overcomes shall not be hurt by the second death." '

Reader: This is the Word of the Lord! ALL: Thanks be to God!

+ Sermon: Series: The state of the Church according to the seven letters to the seven churches in the Book of Revelation; Part 3, the letter to the second church; Smyrna-Persecuted church (A.D. 100-313).

In the Revelation, Christ discloses the course of the life of the church to her perfection at the end (BEDE). Writing to seven churches, John is in fact writing to all churches and to all ages, for the number seven represents the present life (APRINGIUS, ANDREW OF CAESAREA).¹

Part 3 – the second church, Smyrna 8 points of Notice Introduction to part 2

In this study of the seven letters we will make a chart that has four parts: A) Commendation: What Christ approves about this church.

B) Condemnation: What Christ disapproves about this church.

C) Counsel: What Christ suggests to this church.

D) Challenge: What Christ offers to those who accept the instruction and act upon it.

The seven stages of the church will be viewed as cumulative, qualitative, and quantitative. Each stage is cumulative or incremental as it builds in succession on the previous stage and continues forward. Each stage is qualitative as we measure the qualities (good, bad, or indifferent). Finally, each stage is quantitative as we measure the growth or decline of the actual population of persons in each stage of the church. Notice many of these characteristics of each stage of the story of the church continue to the present day. When the study is over, we will look at the chart and use it as a starting place for our own self-evaluation to improve and celebrate our successes.

As I present this series, it will be from three perspectives.

There is the historical perspective – who, what, where, when, and why. The prophetic perspective – what prophecy is here, was some of it or all of it fulfilled by now, and is some of it or all of it to be fulfilled in the future. Thirdly, the spiritual perspective – what universal lessons are revealed and how they might be applied in our present lives.

"The seven periods are generally given approximately as follows:

- 1. Ephesus-Apostolic church (A.D. 30-100)
- 2. Smyrna-Persecuted church (A.D. 100-313)
- 3. Pergamos-State church (A.D. 313-590)
- 4. Thyatira-Papal church (A.D. 590-1517)
- 5. Sardis-Reformed church (A.D. 1517-1790)
- 6. Philadelphia-Missionary church (A.D. 1730-1900)
- 7. Laodicea-Apostate church (A.D. 1900-)"

"Although this time-honored belief that Christ's message to the seven churches includes a prophecy of the seven stages of church history has never been unanimous, it is held by most premillennialists. Even Phillip Schaff, the writer of the classic eight-volume set History of the Christian Church, accepts that position."

1) Rev 2:8 "To the angel (messenger) of the church of Smyrna write, 'These things says the First and the Last, who was dead, and came to life:

Looking back to the vision of Himself in chapter one, Jesus picks out one of the characteristics of his Divine Nature. Jesus is eternal, the "First and the Last." Jesus died for our sins, "who was dead." Jesus is resurrected and alive forever, "and behold I am alive forever and ever." (see 1:18)

One essential unique aspect of Christianity is we worship a living Christ. Christ is alive and present to us. We are not an association that gathers to remember and honor a dead teacher from long ago, or a human prophet not revealed in the Holy Bible, or the thoughts and ideas (teachings) of a contemporary "spiritual" leader, etc. Jesus is the only human being ever to have lived who was born with God's Divine Nature.

A) Commendation: What Christ approves about this church.

2) Rev. 2:9a ⁹ "I know your works,

Among the celebrated works of the second stage of the church was the tremendous growth of the church. The production of many hand-copied manuscripts of the Holy Scriptures translated into many languages is another outstanding accomplishment of this period. In addition, there were many translations into Latin made during this period.

"Collectively, these versions are known as the Vetus Latina and closely follow the Greek Septuagint."

3) Rev. 2:9b tribulation,

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This church age was perhaps the most severely persecuted. The first two periods of persecution under Roman emperors were in the Apostolic Age, during the period covered by the letter to the church of Ephesus, in which two emperors persecuted the church. Then, during the second period represented by the church of Smyrna, eight additional Roman emperors led persecution against the church. Perhaps Emperor Diocletian (284-ca.305 A.D.) is considered the worst of all of the emperors in Rome's history. Many of the cities he led held events for the burning of the Scriptures. Persecutions faced in the second and third centuries included groups of believers fed to hungry wild animals in the amphitheater of Rome while spectators cheered. Believers were also covered in animal skins and tortured to death by wild animals. Other believers were crucified, boiled in oil, covered in tar, and set afire to be used as yard torches, and others burned alive at the stake.

4) Rev. 2:9c and poverty (but you are rich);

As for their "poverty", it resulted from physical persecution, businesses boycotted and even destroyed. Additionally, they lost employment or were overlooked for work. These are some of the ways the society showed disapproval for the "Christians" in an attempt to shut them down. Yet, as Christ mentions in this verse, it was in this very poverty that they were spiritually rich. LaHaye; "Someone has said that the churches of the first three centuries were marked by material poverty and spiritual power, wheras the churches of our day are marked by material wealth and spiritual weakness." (Revelation Unveiled, pg. 54).

(Some of these tatics of persecution are used to systemically attack a population of people even today in modern politics.)

5) Rev. 2:9d and *I know* the blasphemy of those who say they are Jews and are not,

Last, from this verse we remember there were false teachers and false members, even those who said they were Jews but were not. This included the New Testament concept of being a spiritual Jew, meaning July 25, 2021 17th Sunday of the Church Year B page: 15 one who is circumcised in the heart by the Holy Spirit more than just in the flesh according to the Law of Moses. (see Romans 2:29)

6) Rev. 2:9e but are a synagogue of Satan.

The Synagogue of Satan could be rendered the religion of Satan, the entire satanic agenda against the Human Race, the People of God. We have frequently discussed this, so I will summarize by saying that God, the Three In One, is centered on serving and assisting creation as it grows and becomes.

Satan aims to have all of the creation worship himself, Satan, to raise himself above God. Lucifer and all cooperators see the individual, be it an angel, spirit, human, or anyother created being, as capable of being "the Most High" the "Highest" the "god to be worshiped," etc. Many Scripture verses confirm this, but one comes to mind when Satan will exalt himself through the Anti-Christ. In 2 Thessalonians 2:4 we learn that Satan will masquerade in the body of a human who will surrender to Satan. This person will enter the holy of holies in the Third Temple (yet to be built) and sit down on a throne and declare themself to be God and king of the world. Ever since the beginning of the Human Race there have been those who have been attracted to the satanic agenda to dethrone God Almighty of Creation and to take God's place as Soverign over all. These are the disciples, the students of Satan, and they study and worship in the "synagogue of satan." An excellent study on Lucifer / Satan is at Revelation 20:10 in the Scofield Reference Bible.

In our own day, we also see a watering down of Doctrines (unchangeable Truths revealed in Scripture) and Dogmas (established additional beliefs that have long-standing made by the religious authority) in an attempt to blend in with culture and trends of those who have no faith or regular religious discipline.

In our own day we also see all sorts of Teachings (additional beliefs and requirements – that often change quickly made by religious authority) that are often designed to have an impact on secular society. Unfortunately, these teachings are often politically targeted at specific July 25, 2021 17th Sunday of the Church Year B page: 16

populations. The teachings often have no doctrinal basis. They tear down and misrepresent the Gospel of Jesus Christ and His Church.

All misuse of the Name of Jesus and His Church originates in the "synagogue of satan."

By the end of the second century, efforts were underway to confuse or even remove divinity from the person of Christ. Today in the last 200 years, this is commonly known as searching for the "historical Jesus" and separating it from the "mythical Jesus" or the divine Christ of God.

By the end of the second century, efforts were underway to resort to rules of religion and try to disguise them as "law of God" rather than the grace that salvation is based upon.

This rule-based religion is a significant problem in churches and denominations today.

b) Condemnation: What Christ disapproves about this church.

There is not one word of condemnation in this church period. From this, Satan should learn that persecution and physical poverty will never destroy the true Church of Jesus Christ. In fact, at the end of this period the Gospel had become "such a dominant factor in the Roman Empire that Christianity was established as the state church by Emperor Constantine in A.D. 312." (Revelation Unveiled, pg. 53)

C) Counsel: What Christ suggests to this church.

7) Rev. 2:10a ¹⁰ Do not fear any of those things which you are about to suffer. Indeed, the devil is about to throw *some* of you into prison, that you may be tested, and you will have tribulation ten days.

The Christian Church still is persecuted in some countries today. Christians are hunted down for execution in some countries today. A quick Google image search of executed Christians will confirm this. There are numerous documented stories of executions in the media and, they happen every day of the year. Within the Christian Church, specific populations suffer persecution at the hands of church leaders and the state.

Within the church, people are cast aside, excommunicated, shunned, and wrongly not included for reasons (created teachings for this purpose) that have no basis in Scripture or the leadership of the Living Christ among us. Today, some religions claim "revealed" prophecy and even additional "revealed" text that calls for the execution and removal from the world of Christians and or specific populations of people. All of this is against God's will and is using the Lord's Name in vain.

Persons who suffer this way are categorized as "dry martyrs" because their martyrdom is spiritual and emotional, but their physical death has not happened.

As noted above, ten emperors persecuted Christians, which may be indicated here by the "ten days." We also know that in the future, the church will be severely persecuted during the seven-year Tribulation Period under the government of the anti-christ. During the Tribulation Period, there will be physical martyrs ("wet martyrs" "shed blood martyrdom") and dry martyrs.

8) Rev. 2:10b, 11 Be faithful until death, and I will give you the crown of life. ¹¹ "He who has an ear, let him hear what the Spirit says to the churches. He who overcomes shall not be hurt by the second death." '

Trust in Christ and Christ's Doctrines until death seperates one from their physical body, natural death after a life of faithful service, or myrtordom, or they are transformed at the Blessed Hope. Be faithful in all things. This is Christ's command. As our theme song says; "This is our goal: To follow You!"


"See the faith You have gathered here. See our hopes, God, You know our fears. And we'll depend on You, O Spirit of God, to mold us to be Your Body, O Christ.

Jesus, lead us. You may use us; for we want to follow You. O, Jesus, lead us. O God, use us.

July 25, 2021 17th Sunday of the Church Year B page: 18 We do not "retire" from "ministry." We serve until "death do us part."

Christ promises the Crown of Life to each person who remains faithful.



As I stated last Sunday: It is possible to overcome and be alive and serving when He comes in the Blessed Hope. We may be here serving when He arrives, or we may have our particular freedom from this bondage of this world of sin at the time of our particular death, should it be before the Blessed Hope. Either way, we know we are safe and going to the "Paradise of God," which is why I always refer to those who have gone before us as being in Paradise. The Tree of Life, which was once in the Garden of Eden, is in this physical place, Paradise, and will someday be on the renewed earth.

This week the promise is made we shall have no part in "the second death." In short, the second death is the final judgment of the wicked dead. Therefore, NO believers need to be concerned about the so-called "Final Judgment" at "the end of time." The "Final Judgment" is a false concept with no doctrinal basis. We will do a complete study on this. But, for now, understand the moment you believe you have experienced the first stage of the "first resurrection" in Christ.

July 25, 2021 17th Sunday of the Church Year B page: 19 See Revelation 20:6 Blessed and holy is the one who shares in the first resurrection! Over such the second death has no power, but they will be priests of God and of Christ, and they will reign with him for a thousand years.


Those who experience the final jugement of the Wicked Dead, these alone are those who go into the Second Death.

See Revelation 20:14 Then Death and Hades were thrown into the lake of fire. This is the second death, the lake of fire. See Rev. 21:8 the unbelieving and therefore those who refused forgiveness, and followed the religion of satan, they will have their "portion will be in the lake that burns with fire and sulfur, which is the second death."

More on this subject will be taken up in Bible Enrichment.

YOU, HOWEVER: DOCTRINE JOHN 5:24 Jesus promises: "Most assuredly, I say to you, he who hears My word and believes in Him who sent Me has everlasting life, and shall not come into judgment, but has passed from death into life." This is the First Resurrection.

The Spirit has just told you what the Holy Spirit has been saying this entire age, listen, understand, and follow to the faithful conclusion of this way of life, the Paradise of God. We can do this!



Everyone is invited to receive Holy Communion, also known as The Eucharist, The Lord's Table, or The Blessed Sacrament at Ray Of Hope Church Of Our Lord Jesus Christ, Inc. July 25, 2021 17th Sunday of the Church Year B page: 36 It is not required that you be a member of this church or any other church, to receive Holy Communion at / or with Ray Of Hope Church.

This Holy Communion is the Table of Jesus Christ, who is really present among us. Jesus invites you to receive Him in this Eucharistic banquet. If this is your first time receiving The Blessed Sacrament, let us know before you receive or right after, so we might pray a special prayer of thanksgiving with you.

Unfortunately, through the centuries many institutional churches have established rules, teachings, and practices that would exclude people from Holy Communion. There has been an almost endless list of reasons to exclude people from the Blessed Sacrament. Yet, together, during the worship service, we recite the very words of Jesus, the Words of Institution, "This is my body. This is my blood," and we rehear Christ present with us saying: "Take this, all of you and eat; Take this all of you and drink" of this gift.

I am including this information here to assist people who may want to take action now to encourage their members of the Senate of the United States to know the facts and identify the false information being put forth in the hearings that are happening now on the Equality Act. Dear Friend,

Last month the House passed the <u>Equality Act (H.R. 5)</u>. For those unaware, this important legislation would amend existing civil rights laws, such as the *Civil Rights Act of 1964*, to include sexual orientation, and gender identity as protected characteristics under law. The bill also expands federal non-discrimination protections regarding discrimination based on race, color, national origin, **religion**, sex, sexual orientation or gender identity in public settings, and protects against sex-based discrimination in government services and federally-funded programs.

This week, the Senate held its first ever hearing on the <u>Equality Act</u> and as expected, the debate was heated. It seems opponents of the bill (Senate Republicans) are promoting <u>several misconceptions</u> about its purpose and scope which include:

- "The Equality Act would destroy religious freedom in this country."
 - NOT TRUE. Freedom of religion is already protected by the First Amendment of the U.S. Constitution. Nothing in the *Equality Act* would change that. The bill simply extends those rights that most vulnerable groups are already afforded to those who have been denied them, such as the LGBTQ community. In fact, the bill actually protects freedom of religion by preventing the imposing of one's religion upon another.
- "The Equality Act will make athletics unfair for females."
 - NOT TRUE. Schools across the nation already have policies in place to ensure a level playing field for all students, and they are working. Additionally, except for a very small percentage, most students who participate in high school sports do not continue on with their athletic endeavours after high school. The possibility that perhaps one or two transgender students in an entire student body would ruin that opportunity for another is <u>almost nonexistent</u>. *Title IX* is extremely important in regards to girls athletics, and the bottom line is that nothing in the *Equality Act* changes that. Instead, we should be calling for increased funding for girls athletics.
- "The Equality Act_will allow men to harass women in public restrooms."
 - NOT TRUE. We already have laws in place to prevent such acts, and the Equality Act does

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nothing to change that. Additionally, **21 states** have had similar nondiscrimination laws on the books for decades now and they have worked, as there have been no increases in public safety incidents in bathrooms since they were codified.

It is important that we dispel these <u>untrue myths</u> about this legislation, which seeks only to provide the same protections that most of us already are afforded to those who are not. We must always push back against these false narratives whenever they are presented. Only by doing so will we be able to do away with the myths and focus on the <u>facts of the issue</u>, which is equal treatment under the law for everyone, regardless of race, religion, gender, sexual identity, or sexual orientation.
