June 1, 2024, was the TWENTY-FIRST ANNIVERSARY OF THE OPENING OF THE ELMIRA CHAPEL.

Today is August 11, 2024, Pentecost Week 13, the nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year B, in the cycle of Scripture readings known as the Lectionary. Today is also the Feast of St. Clare of Assisi, Virgin and companion of St. Francis of Assisi. As noted above, our bell is dedicated to the honor of St. Francis and St. Clare of Assisi. As stated above in this bulletin, our bell is a gift from Michael Quinnell of Syracuse, NY. Today is also week three in the five-week study of John Chapter 6, the Bread of Life, in the Lectionary. Theologians of every major denomination worked together to organize this schedule of readings as far back as the late 1960s. There must have been consensus, which must continue to this day, that John Chapter 6 is essential to understanding ourselves as Christians. Notably, there are four weeks in the Season of Advent and six weeks in the Season of Lent. Therefore, setting aside five weeks on the Bread of Life indicates this topic is significant. We shall see if you agree that John Chapter 6 is vital in 2024 as we study it together. This church's goal is to show us how to bring Christ to every area of our lives.

Leader - 1: Please be seated. Today, we light our Candle Of Hope to show by this action of lighting this candle again that we celebrate our faith and trust in the promised "Blessed Hope," also known as "The Rapture," the return of Christ who will transform the living faithful and raise all to new life. I invite you to say these words of Jesus again to celebrate the Truth they promise us. Jesus said: (John 5:25 and Titus 2:13)

ALL: "I am the resurrection and the life. Those who believe in me, even though they die, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die." (John 11:25, 26)

Leader -2: In 1983, Ray Of Hope Church was started in part to form a unique ministry to persons affected by and infected with HIV/AIDS. Our witness to God's love for all people is as relevant today as it was then. Here we are forty-one years later, and some churches, religions, and, yes, even some countries continue rejecting the sick, lonely, and dying people with HIV/AIDS who need spiritual guidance. In a letter we recently received from amfAR, The Foundation for AIDS Research, we learn every minute that someone somewhere contracts HIV; today, right now, think

about it. In the year 2023, 1.5 million people became newly infected, and 650,000 people, including some from the United States, died of AIDS-related causes.

HIV/AIDS is still with us; therefore, at Ray Of Hope Church Of Our Lord Jesus Christ, we continue to read aloud over **110,000** names sewn into the AIDS Memorial Quilt to keep HIV/AIDS in the conscious prayers of people.

Leader 3: Please be seated. (wait) So far, we assembled, greeted one another, and praised God in song. Now, Ray Of Hope Church provides another service: Christ forgiving our sins through the powerful ministry of the Holy Spirit. Leader -1: Being made your image, Lord, we should not participate in systemic racism, homophobia, exclusion, sexism, and other divisive ideologies; Lord, have mercy.

ALL: Lord, have mercy.

Leader -1: Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the World; have mercy on us.

ALL: Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the World, grant us peace.

Leader-3: Jesus told the Church to forgive sins in His Name. Jesus said:

ALL: If you forgive people their sins, your heavenly Father will also forgive you. But if you do not forgive people their sins, neither will your Father forgive your sins." (Matt. 6:14-15) Jesus also told us to forgive our brothers and sisters from the heart. (Matt. 18:35).

Pastor: We pray that all of God's people may one day be reunited in God's Kingdom without the loss of anyone. Therefore, we ask Almighty God to have mercy on all of us, forgive all our sins, and keep us in everlasting life.






2 Corinthians 4:5-6 ⁵ For we do not proclaim ourselves; we proclaim Jesus Christ as Lord and ourselves as your slaves for Jesus' sake. ⁶ For it is the God who said, "Light will shine

out of darkness," who has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Christ. (NRSVUE)

"On August 11, we celebrate the feast day of St. Francis' partner in holiness, St. Clare of Assisi." (Bret Thoman, OFS) Chiara Offreduccio b. July 16, 1194, to d. August 11, 1253.

Clare entered the then all-male Franciscan Order on Palm Sunday, March 20, 1212, and lived her remaining 41 years as a Sister under the Rule of the Franciscans. Eventually, more than fifty women joined Clare at San Damiano, including three other family members, her mother, and two blood sisters. Clare was the first woman to write a Rule for monasteries that the Pope approved. Clare started the Order of Poor Ladies, which followed strict poverty, and after her death, in her honor, the women renamed it the Order of Saint Clare, today commonly known as The Poor Clares. There are Roman Catholic, Anglican, Lutheran, and Independent houses of The Poor Clares today, numbering about 30,000 women worldwide.

There are special readings selected for the Feast of St. Clare in the Lectionary. Since the theology of the Franciscan charism aligns so beautifully with our own at Ray Of Hope, I decided to share with you some of the highlights of the readings for St. Clare.

First reading Philippians 3:8-14 "I consider everything as a loss (rubbish) when I consider knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. Today is week three of a five-week study on John Chapter 6 to explain the Doctrine of Jesus, who gives himself to us in the Bread of Life and the Cup of Salvation commonly referred to as Holy Communion, The Eucharist, The Lord's Supper, and many other names including The Blessed Sacrament. REFLECTIONS ON TODAY'S READINGS

The Angel Of The Lord = Summary on page 341 of the Scofield III, NKJV Bible (find to order here) Christ in his pre-incarnate form appearing, meaning to be manifested visibly, to save a believer from peril or even death.

In the first reading, 1 Kings 19:4-8, Elijah is on the run because Jezebel is furious that all of her priests died in the challenge to Elijah and his God. Elijah has run "a day's journey" vs. 4, resting under a juniper tree when the Angel of the Lord comes to him twice, touching and speaking to him. The Angel of the Lord has a body that can talk, touch, move, and transcend the natural laws of physics. The Angel of the Lord also provided bread from heaven, the bread of the angels, the bread of life to sustain Elijah, both his physical and spiritual wellbeing. Does any of this sound familiar, like in our prayer of consecration over the Eucharist? Last week, we had Exodus 16:4 4. Then the LORD said to Moses, "I am going to rain Bread from Heaven for you, and each day the people shall go out and gather enough for that day."

Two weeks ago, we read If 2 Kings 4:43b, where Elisha tells the servant to give the people the barley loaves to the people: So he repeated, "Give it to the people and let them eat, for thus says the LORD: They shall eat and have some left."

Today's reading, the Bread is indeed from Heaven, the Food of the Angels, giving life physically and spiritually. Do notice Elijah and The Angel of the Lord are on the way to the Mountain of God, and the Angel of the Lord is providing the Bread and showing Elijah the Way, or the road, to the Mountain of God. Jesus is the True Bread from Heaven, and He is showing us the Way, the road to the Father's House (John 14:1-7).

I invite us to consider again the titles we have from Scripture.

The Bread From Heaven (Exodus 16:2, Psalm 78:24, John 6:32, 41,50,58),

The Bread of the Angels (Psalm 78:25),

The Bread of God (John 6:33),

The Living Bread (John 6:51),

The Bread Of Life (John 6:35, 48, 58),

The Bread of the New Covenant (John 6:32, 49, 50,51, 58),

The Sacrament of the Eucharist, the Body Of Christ (John 6:52-56, 1 Corinthians 10:16).

The Cup of Our Salvation (Psalm 116:13),

The Cup of Everlasting Life (John 6:54-57),

The Cup of the New Covenant (Matthew 26:28, Luke 22:20, 1 Corinthians 11:25),

The very Blood Of Christ (John 6:54-56; 1Corinthians 10:16)

Today's Psalm 34 speaks loudly of our place as believers in Christ filled with the Eucharist, the Bread from Heaven. We "bless the Lord at all times" (vs. 2). The praise of God is always on our lips (vs. 3). We pray; glorify the Lord with me (vs. 4). Together, we praise God's name. "It is right to give God thanks and praise." (vs 4b). In verse 8, "The Angel of the Lord is encamped around those who fear God, to rescue them," The Angel of the Lord is always there to rescue us. Again, please consult The Angel Of The Lord = Summary on page 341 of the Scofield III, NKJV Bible for further study on this Doctrine.

In today's second reading, Ephesians 4:30-5:2, we learn we can grieve the Holy Spirit. How do we grieve the Holy Spirit? There are many ways to sadden the Holy Spirit with our thoughts, words, deeds, and intentional omissions. Today's

second reading states we sadden the Holy Spirit when we do not recognize the Body of Christ as described in 1 Corinthians 11:29 (29 For all who eat and drink without discerning the body eat and drink judgment against themselves. NRSVUE). Applying this to the second reading, we fail to recognize the Body of Christ when we mistreat each other, when we are not kind, when we are bitter, when we are angry, when we participate in slander.... and these are not just in general but specific to how we treat others inside the Church and then by extension to others outside the Church.

At the start of the worship, we say "Welcome one another, then, as Christ welcomed you, for the glory of God." (NABRE) In Ephesians 4:32, we have the following: "Forgive one another, then, as God in Christ has forgiven you." In the Episcopal prayer book, the offertory may begin with Ephesians 5:2: "Walk in love, as Christ loved us and gave himself up for us, a fragrant offing and sacrifice to God."

Ignatius of Antioch, in 110 AD says, "Take note of those who hold heretical opinions on the grace of Jesus Christ which has come to us, and see how contrary their opinions are to the mind of God. . . . They abstain from the Eucharist and from prayer because they do not confess that the Eucharist is the flesh of our Saviour Jesus Christ, flesh which suffered for our sins and which that Father, in his goodness, raised up again. They who deny the gift of God are perishing in their disputes" (Letter to the Smyrnaeans 6:2–7:1).

Ignatius also writes, "I have no taste for corruptible Food nor for the pleasures of this life. I desire the Bread of God, which is the flesh of Jesus Christ, who was of the seed of David; and for drink I desire his blood, which is love incorruptible" (Letter to the Romans 7:3).

Justin Martyr in 151AD says, "We call this food Eucharist, and no one else is permitted to partake of it, except one who believes our teaching to be true and who has been washed in the washing which is for the remission of sins and for regeneration [i.e., has received baptism] and is thereby living as Christ enjoined. For not as common Bread nor common drink do we receive these; but since Jesus Christ our Saviour was made incarnate by the word of God and had both flesh and blood for our salvation, so too, as we have

B Page 25 of 43 been taught, the Food which has been made into the Eucharist by the Eucharistic prayer set down by him, and by the change of which our blood and flesh is nurtured, is both the flesh and the blood of that incarnated Jesus" (First Apology 66).

Irenaeus, 189 AD, writes, "If the Lord were from other than the Father, how could he rightly take bread, which is of the same creation as our own, and confess it to be his body and affirm that the mixture in the cup is his blood?" (Against Heresies 4:33–32).


