Maximilian Kolbe, who died in Auschwitz in 1941. Today is also week four in the fiveweek study of John Chapter 6, the Bread of Life, in the Lectionary. This church's goal is to show us how to bring Christ to every area of our lives.

+ The Candle Of Hope



Today, we light our Candle Of Hope to show by this action of lighting this candle again that we celebrate our faith and trust in the promised "Blessed Hope," also known as "The Rapture," the return of Christ who will transform the living faithful and raise all to new life. I invite you to say these words of Jesus again to celebrate the Truth they promise us. Jesus said: (John 5:25 and Titus 2:13)

ALL: "I am the resurrection and the life. Those who believe in me, even though they die, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die." (John 11:25, 26)

Leader -2: In 1983, Ray Of Hope Church was started in part to form a unique ministry to persons affected by and infected with HIV/AIDS. Our witness to God's love for all people is as relevant today as it was then. Here we are forty-one years later, and some churches, religions, and, yes, even some countries continue rejecting the sick, lonely, and dying people with HIV/AIDS who need spiritual guidance. In a letter we recently received from amfAR, The Foundation for AIDS Research, we learn every minute that someone somewhere contracts HIV; today, right now, think about it. In the year 2023, 1.5 million people became newly infected, and 650,000 people, including some from the United States, died of AIDS-related causes.

HIV/AIDS is still with us; therefore, at Ray Of Hope Church Of Our Lord Jesus Christ, we continue to read aloud over **110,000** names sewn into the AIDS Memorial Quilt to keep HIV/AIDS in the conscious prayers of people.

ALL: If you forgive people their sins, your heavenly Father will also forgive you. But if you do not forgive people their sins, neither will your Father forgive your sins." (Matt. 6:14-15) Jesus also told us to forgive our brothers and sisters from the heart. (Matt. 18:35).






2 Corinthians 4:5-6 ⁵ For we do not proclaim ourselves; we proclaim Jesus Christ as Lord and ourselves as your slaves for Jesus' sake. ⁶ For it is the God who said, "Light will shine out of darkness," who has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Christ. (NRSVUE)

Today is week four of a five-week study on John Chapter 6 to explain the Doctrine of Jesus, who gives himself to us in the Bread of Life and the Cup of Salvation commonly referred to as Holy Communion, The Eucharist, The Lord's

The Angel Of The Lord = Summary on page 341 of the Scofield III, NKJV Bible (find to <u>order here</u>) Christ in his pre-incarnate form appearing, meaning to be manifested visibly, to save a believer from peril or even death.

Last week, we had 1 Kings 19:4-8; Elijah is touched twice by The Angel of The Lord, who provides warm bread on hot stones and water for Elijah for both his spiritual and physical well-being.

Two weeks ago, we read Exodus 16:4 ⁴. Then the LORD said to Moses, "I amgoing to rain Bread from Heaven for you, and each day the people shall go out and gather enough for that day."

Three weeks ago, we read 2 Kings 4:43b, where Elisha tells the servant to give the people the barley loaves to the people: So he repeated, "Give it to the people and let them eat, for thus says the LORD: They shall eat and have some left."

Today's reading, the Bread is a gift from God, known here in the feminine as Wisdom. The reading is in the Book of Proverbs, but to some, it may sound like the Book of Wisdom in the Apocrypha. The two books confirm the other. Do notice the pronouns she and her. Here, She invites us to Her Table to receive Her Bread and Her Wine. Notice the connection to the second reading in Ephesians, where we are exhorted to walk circumspectly, to walk carefully, to be wise and not foolish. The wisdom we seek is to know God's will and follow that. We are exhorted not to be drunk with the wine of this world. Yes, it does mean being inebriated literally (not a church rule for restriction on drinking or being high as you may responsibly choose to be; this is about irresponsibly being high or drunk as one's answer to looking for life's wisdom) but it also a metaphor meaning seduction (drunk) into the false wisdom based only upon human knowledge, discovery, and theory. When we set the parameters of what

we declare to be truth on what is humanly discovered, we are very limited in our knowledge base.

God in Christ and through the powerful ministry of the Holy Spirit opens to us "the mind of Christ" (1 Corinthians 2:6- 16).

Where can we be fed this spiritual Wisdom? We are invited to her table to eat in today's first reading. In the second reading, we are urged to live by God's wisdom, or Wisdom, made known to us in Christ.

In the Gospel, John Chapter 6, Jesus teaches a new Wisdom to the Human Race. Jesus is explaining a new dispensation was about to begin. What was previously done under the Law of Moses, under the Family of Abraham, and taught by the Prophets, would soon be in His Name with the authority of His commandments. Jesus would build His Church with His commandments and with His own sacred food of His flesh and blood (something radically new to the People) that would continue to taste, smell, and feel familiar as the bread of Moses and the cup of Elijah. The Law and its Passover Bread, along with the Prophets and the Cup of Elijah, would continue. It will still taste like bread and wine, but now you will have new Wisdom to understand this is no longer just bread for the journey as it was in the desert and for Elijah fleeing Jezebel, but it would also be for your spiritual selves as it would give Eternal Life. Jesus is the True Bread from Heaven, and He is showing us the Way, the road to the Father's House (John 14:1-7).

Jesus taught these truths when He said: "⁵⁴ Those who eat my flesh and drink my blood have eternal life, and I will raise them up on the last day, ⁵⁵ for my flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink. ⁵⁶ Those who eat my flesh and drink my blood abide in me, and I in them. ⁵⁷ Just as the living Father sent me and I live because of the Father, so whoever eats me will live because of me. ⁵⁸ This is the bread that came down from heaven, not like that which the ancestors ate, and they died. But the one who eats this bread will live forever." ⁵⁹ He said these things while he was teaching in a synagogue at Capernaum. (John 6: 54-59)

On Wednesday, we celebrated the lives of two men who gave their lives doing the will of Christ, putting the social ministry of applied Christianity into action.

St. Maximilian Kolbe, 1936.

He was born Raymund Kolbe on the 8th of January in 1894 in Poland. He was ordained in 1918. Fr. Kolbe used publishing extensively and even founded new monasteries where publishing was a significant outreach ministry. Fr. Kolbe founded monasteries in Niepokalanow, Poland, India, and Japan. Poor health caused him to return to his home monastery in 1936. When the Germans invaded Poland in the Fall of 1939, he and a very few other Brothers remained in the monastery. They opened a temporary hospital, and they also sheltered and hid as many as 2,000 Jews and other refugees. The social conditions required him to take a stance against the Nazi and German leaders and politicians.

Ultimately the Nazis shut down the monastery on February 17, 1941. Fr. Kolbe was taken to the Pawiak prison by the German Gestapo. Then, after three months, he was transferred to Auschwitz. There is a very detailed first-hand account of how Fr. Kolbe was treated at Auschwitz by an eyewitness, Mr. Francis Gajowniczek on this website:

Around 1983, American Franciscan Fr. James McCurry, OFM Conv. picked up Mr. Francis Gajowniczek, who traveled to Ellicott City, Maryland, to share his story of how Fr. Kolbe stepped forward and said, "I'd like to take that man's place" and saved him from execution by the Nazis. It was a ruthless punishment in what was known as the "Block of Death," an underground bunker where prisoners were starved to death with windows at ground level so others could hear their cries of agony. Fr. Kolbe turned the Bock of Death into a sanctuary, leading the men in songs and prayers, according to many eyewitnesses who have offered interviews. Ultimately, after two weeks of starvation, death was hastened by an injection of carbolic acid. 

Jonathan Myrick Daniels. In March 1965, a 26-year-old seminarian at the Episcopal Seminary in Boston and several classmates and friends answered Dr. Martin Luther King's call to come to Selma, Alabama, and participate in the 55-mile march for voting rights from Selma to the state capital, Montgomery. Having missed their bus back home, Jonathan and a friend, Judith Upham, received permission to stay in Alabama for the rest of the summer and return to take the semester exams. Jonathan stayed with a local African-American family, the Wests. He participated in many Episcopal church outreach and education programs and demonstrations that summer.

8-18-24 corrected Pentecost Week 14, Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time Yr. B Page 25 of 43 Indeed, that summer, on August 2, 1965, Congress passed the Voting Rights Act, providing federal oversight and enforcement of the right to vote.

Twelve days later, on August 14, he was one of 29 protesters, including members of SNCC, to be arrested for picketing a whites-only store. They were transported to jail in a garbage truck to another town. Bail was not offered for their release. On August 20, they were suddenly released with no transportation plans.


Jonathan, a white Catholic priest, and two African-American female activists walked to the Varner's Cash Store for a cold soft drink. At the door, they were met by Tom L. Coleman, who pointed a shotgun at Ruby Sales, one of the women with them. Jonathan Daniels pushed her aside, took the full shotgun blast, and was killed instantly. When Dr. King heard this, he said, "One of the most heroic Christian deeds of which I have heard in my entire ministry was performed by Jonathan Daniels."

The Episcopal Church designated Jonathan Myrick Daniels a Martyr in 1991 and made his Feast Day August 14, the same day as Fr. Kolbe.

Before leaving the remarks about these two witnesses for Christ, Fr. Kolbe and Seminarian Daniels, I want to connect them to Mary's Canticle we recited today. I looked up the special readings the Episcopal Church, USA schedules for Jonathan Daniels, and the Canticle of Mary is the Gospel for the day. Fr. Kolbe had a very public devotion to Mary as "Our Blessed Mother" and the Immaculate one, naming his published paper "The Immaculata." When we look at the Canticle of Mary line-by-line, the Holy Spirit has supplied the Christian Martyr with all the Spiritual and physical Wisdom they will need in the moment or the hours or the weeks of their persecution as they give their life for Christ. Remember, Jesus said, "No greater love does anyone have than to lay down their life for their friend." (John 15:13) Both men, Saint Jonathan Daniels and Saint Kolbe did give their lives so others might live. According to worldly wisdom, they both could have been criticized for doing things that ended in their deaths (hiding 2000 + Jews and Refugees) (leaving the safety of the college campus and voluntarily entering racial conflicts in the center of protests in 1965). However, according to God's Wisdom, both men lived on the Bread Of Life and the Cup of Salvation, and both men were baptized into His death and will indeed participate in His Resurrection. They lived the Gospel to their final heartbeat.

I invite us to consider again the titles we have from Scripture.

The Bread From Heaven (Exodus 16:2, Psalm 78:24, John 6:32, 41,50,58),

The Bread of the Angels (Psalm 78:25),

The Bread of God (John 6:33),

The Living Bread (John 6:51),

The Bread Of Life (John 6:35, 48, 58),

The Bread of the New Covenant (John 6:32, 49, 50,51, 58),

The Sacrament of the Eucharist, the Body Of Christ (John 6:52-56, 1 Corinthians 10:16).

The Cup of Our Salvation (Psalm 116:13),

The Cup of Everlasting Life (John 6:54-57),

The Cup of the New Covenant (Matthew 26:28, Luke 22:20, 1 Corinthians 11:25),

The very Blood Of Christ (John 6:54-56; 1Corinthians 10:16)

In my observation, during the first 1,000 years, the Church clearly and unanimously believed that Christ was literally present in the Eucharist; it is unquestionable. These were disciples of the Apostles, meaning the Apostles almost definitely taught the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist. I observe the conflicts that later arise over this question about the Real Presence are concerning how this change takes place, a question no mortal can answer, not because it is idiotic or ridiculous, but only because it is an operation of the eternal Divine God, not our doing. (Br. Shawn Benedict. If someone else deserves credit for any of this statement, it is from information stored in my thoughts, not an intentional omission.)


