Gospel Acclamation



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+ Thoughts on Today's Gospel.

Today is the third of five Sundays the lectionary schedules a slow study through the sixth chapter of John. THE BREAD OF LIFE.

Jesus declares: Everyone our God gives me will come to me, and anyone who comes to me I will never drive away; 38 for I have come from heaven, not to do my own will, but the will of the One who sent me. 39 And this is the will of the One who sent me, that I should lose nothing of all that God has given me, but raise it up on the last day. 40 This is indeed the will of God,

August 8, 2021 19th Sunday of the Church Year B page: 10 that everyone who sees the Only Begotten and believes in him will have eternal life; and I will raise them up on the last day."

Commentary: Anyone who comes to me I will never drive away. (Vs. 6:37) It is wrong of the Church to turn people away from Jesus, figuratively or actually. The Church is guilty of turning people away largely by being overzealous with commitments to church teachings and dogmas.

2) 47 Very truly, I tell you, whoever believes has eternal life. 48 I am the bread of life. 49 Your ancestors ate the manna in the wilderness, and they died. 50 This is the bread that comes down from heaven, so that one may eat of it and not die. 51 I am the living bread that came down from heaven. Whoever eats of this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give for the life of the world is my flesh."

Commentary: Some have suggested this entire chapter is not about the Eucharist at all. Instead, Jesus is saying to believe in Him is to do the work of God. Unlike the manna that fell from Heaven to temporarily sustain the pilgrim people in the desert, He is the real bread from Heaven. To believe in Jesus is to receive the True Bread from Heaven. Believing will lead to everlasting life.

However, then he says, "the bread that I will give for the life of the world is my flesh." Again, some say eventhough this is future tense He is only speaking of the crucifixion itself and not of a holy bread that would continue in the Church.

+ Second Reading

Reader: Hello. My name is ______ and I am in the City of ______ in the State of ______. The second reading is in the Book of Revelation chapter 2, verses 18 - 29. Here begins the reading:

The Corrupt Church

¹⁸ "And to the angel of the church in Thyatira write,

'These things says the Son of God, who has eyes like a flame of fire, and His feet like fine brass: ¹⁹ "I know your works, love, service, faith, and your patience; and *as* for your works, the last *are* more than the first. ²⁰ Nevertheless I have a few things against you, because you allow that woman Jezebel, who calls herself a prophetess, to teach and seduce My servants to commit sexual immorality (fornication) (G4203 PORNEUO temple prostitution) and eat things sacrificed to idols. ²¹ And I gave her time to repent of her sexual immorality (fornication G4202 PORNEIA from 4203 female temple prostitute), and she did not repent. ²² Indeed I will cast her into a sickbed, and those who commit adultery with her into great tribulation, unless they repent of their deeds. ²³ I will kill her children with death, and all the churches shall know that I am He who searches the minds and hearts. And I will give to each one of you according to your works.



+ Sermon: Series: The state of the Church according to the seven letters to the seven churches in the Book of Revelation

"In the Revelation, Christ discloses the course of the life of the Church to her perfection at the end (BEDE). Writing to seven churches, John is in fact writing to all churches and to all ages, for the number seven represents the present life (APRINGIUS, ANDREW OF CAESAREA)."

PERTAINING TO ALL THE CHURCHES. APRINGIUS OF BEJA: What is the importance of the people of Asia that they alone deserve to receive the apostolic revelation? However, there is a mystery in the number and a sacrament in the name of the province. First, let us discuss the meaning of the number, because both the number six and the number seven are always used in the law with a mystical meaning: "For God made heaven and earth in six days," and "on the seventh day he rested from his works"⁸ and "on it," it says, "they shall enter again into my rest." The number seven, therefore, signifies the period of the present life, so that the apostle is not merely writing to seven churches and to that world in which he was then present, but it is understood that he is giving

these writings to all future ages, even to the consummation of the world. Therefore, he mentions the number in a most holy manner, and he names "Asia," which means "elevated" or "walking," indicating that celestial fatherland which we call the "catholic church." For exalted by the Lord and always moving toward the things which are above, it is the Church which advances by spiritual exercises and is always desirous of the things of heaven. TRACTATE ON THE APOCALYPSE 1:4.¹

In this study of the seven letters, we will make a chart that has four parts:

A) Commendation: What Christ approves about this Church.

B) Condemnation: What Christ disapproves about this Church.

C) Counsel: What Christ suggests to this Church.

D) Challenge: What Christ offers to those who accept the instruction and act upon it.

We will review the seven stages of the Church as cumulative, qualitative, and quantitative. Each stage is cumulative or incremental as it builds in succession on the previous stage and continues forward. Each stage is qualitative as we measure the qualities (good, bad, or indifferent). Finally, each stage is quantitative as we measure the growth or decline of the actual population of persons in each stage of the Church. Notice many of these characteristics of each stage of the Church's story continue to the present day. When the study is over, we will look at the chart and use it as a starting place for our self-evaluation to improve and celebrate our successes.

As I present this series, it will be from three perspectives.

There is the historical perspective – who, what, where, when, and why. The prophetic perspective – what prophecy is here, was some of it or all of it fulfilled by now, and is some of it or all of it to be fulfilled in the future. Thirdly, the spiritual perspective – what universal lessons are revealed and how they might be applied in our present lives.


Series Part 5 – the fourth Church, Thyatira-Papal Church (A.D. 606-1520 to the Tribulation) pages 65 – 71 seven points of Notice Introduction to part 5

1) Historical Background: Alexander the Great was probably the founder of the City of Thyatira about 300 years before the birth of Jesus. It is the modern Turkish city of Akhisar located in the far west of Turkey, south of Istanbul, and east of Athens. One of its earlier names is Semiramis, a name some will recognize as that of one, if not the, greatest goddesses of fertility. The religion of Semiramis made extensive use of temple prostitution. It was a Mother Goddess, Queen of Heaven, Mother Nature, religion. Semiramis the Queen of Heaven, has a divine son who dies and is raised and becomes her holy spouse.

In the First Century A.D., the city of Thyatira was famous for cloth dyeing facilities and was a center for purple cloth and dye.

(https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Thyatira) The color purple and the industry under a woman named Lydia (which also happens to be one of the ancient names of this district) is documented in Acts 16:14+. Archeologists have confirmed there were many guilds, more than any other in the region, in Thyatira. According to the Wikipedia article cited above, the industries included wool-workers, linen-worders, tanners, potters, bakers, slavedealers, and bronze-smiths, outer garments makers, and others. We find one of the seven churches that received a letter in the Book of Revelation in this worldly prosperous area. It appears there were people still worshiping the fertility religions. A woman named Jezebel called herself a prophetess who successfully mixed religions and drew some of the Christians away from pure faith.

On a broader scale, this is the powerful Church of the Roman Empire with a robust hierarchical leadership that developed into Minor and Major Orders that were steps of ascension in ministry, with the highest being the Supreme Pontiff of Rome, the Pope.



August 8, 2021 19th Sunday of the Church Year B page: 16 The Roman Empire had fallen between 376-476, and the bishops were ready to become local governors. Cities were called a diocese with the Bishop as head of the local governments. Eventually, the diocese combined and formed arch-dioceses with Archbishops. Those were combined to form areas under Cardinals, and on it went as they forged a concept of a united, "universal" (catholic) church.

In this period, many writers do not include Pope Gregory, I or The Great, as he led the Roman Church from 9-3-590 – 3-12-604. However, his influence endured through the Middle Ages. Pope Gregory codified the liturgy and especially Gregorian Chant. Musicians were schooled in Rome and sent out to all the churches to teach this music and liturgy.

> "Continual Sacrifice"-Rome's Greatest Heresy "Thyatira" comes from two words meaning "sacrifice" and "continual"; this introduces the central heresy that has produced other false doctrines. That is, the Church of Rome denies the finished work of Christ but believes in a continuing sacrifice that produces such things as sacraments and praying for the dead, burning candles, and so forth. All of these were borrowed from mystery Babylon, the mother of all pagan customs and idolatry, none of which is taught in the New Testament. During this period, between A.D. 607 to today, the Universal (Catholic) Church headquartered in Rome gradually became more Babylonian than Christian. Heresy falls into one of two basic categories: a false concept of the personal deity of Christ or mixing works with faith. The Church of Rome can scarcely be accused of teaching a false concept of the personal deity of Christ; however, their emphasis on the "continual sacrifice" and rejection of our Lord's finished work breeds a concept that causes people to try to earn their own salvation by works, penance, indulgences, and many other satanically conceived ideas labeled by our Lord in Revelation 2:24 as "Satan's so-called deep secrets."

However, with power, worldly wisdom – universities, and the concept of the church being the kingdom of God on Earth, came numerous theological errors. Nevertheless, this Church continues on into the Tribulation Period.

2) Rev 2:18 ¹⁸ "And to the angel of the church in Thyatira write, 'These things says the Son of God, who has eyes like a flame of fire, and His feet like fine brass:

As in other introductory sentences to each of the churches, Jesus gives a self-revelation. Jesus calls Himself the Son Of God. When you hear modern theologians discussing a "historical" and "mythical" Jesus, keep this in mind. Ray Of Hope Church teaches Jesus in the Only Begotten Son Of God. See our article on this <u>Right Click Here</u>. As for the eyes like blazing fire and feet like burnished bronze, we see Jesus looking with piercing judgment on the Church for letting false teaching creep into that misleads "my servants."

A) Commendation: What Christ approves about this Church.

3) Rev. 2:19 "I know your works, love, service, faith, and your patience; and as for your works, the last are more than the first."

LaHaye: Our Lord's commendation to the church of Thyatira comes in the form of six words (Rev. 2:19). He commends them for their (1) "deeds"-indicating that many through Rome's long history have been faithfully serving Jesus Christ as a result of receiving Him; (2) "love"-a love for humankind characterized this church, for in ancient times hospitals and sanitariums were almost exclusively the work of the church through its nuns and priests; (3) "faith"-although it is not given the prominence of works and love, it nevertheless is a characteristic of that age and church, with the main exception noted in the paragraph above; (4) "service" means ministry; (5) "perseverance" means endurance and speaks of the long time period of this church; (6) "now doing more than you did at first"-the good works of the Church of Rome

4) Rev. 2:20-21:²⁰ Nevertheless I have ^[d]a few things against you, because you allow ^[e]that woman Jezebel, who calls herself a prophetess, ^[f]to teach and seduce My servants to commit sexual immorality (fornication) (G4203 PORNEUO temple prostitution) and eat things sacrificed to idols. ²¹ And I gave her time to ^[g]repent of her sexual immorality (fornication G4202 PORNEIA from 4203 female temple prostitute), and she did not repent.

It is particularly important for us to see the words porneuo (G4203) in verse 20 and porneia (G4202) in verse 21. We have shown extensive research on these biblical Koine Greek words and their corresponding Hebrew words. While the English word selection in most Bible renditions make it seem this is all about sex and some female prostitution figuratively or otherwise, scholars have shown this is part of a system developed to misread ancient languages and impose modern condemnations of sexual orientations and gender expression over the text. The unsuspecting "layperson" does not know the subject at hand is very specific and has nothing at all to do with sexuality as we understand it today. As for the "opportunity to repent," we are living in this very drama. Churches struggle with these questions in our day largely because the scholarship has been published since 1953 (Bailey), and continues to grow exponentially almost yearly at this point. Some Denominations are repenting, and others are digging in. But, unfortunately, the modern descendent off the church of Thyatira, and her Pontiff, Pope Francis, cannot even welcome LGBTQIA+ people, and refuses to "bless" our relationships. This is spiritual prostitution, getting into bed with the lie and perpetuating it "in the Name of Jesus." This goes for all Protestant Churches who do the same.

5) Rev. 2:22-23 ²² Indeed I will cast her into a sickbed, and those who commit adultery with her into great tribulation, unless they repent of their

6) Rev. 2:24-25 ²⁴ "Now to you I say, and to the rest in Thyatira, as many as do not have this doctrine, who have not known the depths of Satan, as they say, I will put on you no other burden. ²⁵ But hold fast what you have till I come.

There have always been very faithful saints in this, the largest of all the Denominations in the world, the Roman Catholic Church. In every time and place the works of this Church have had much to celebrate. Never call this Church "evil" or a "throne of satan" because no matter where you point to her, there is a faithful saint inside. Christ has spoken, all one has to do is stay doctrinally pure and be a voice of reform and growth. Be faithful to Christ and He will fulfill all of His promises to believers in this church.





Everyone has access to the Holy Spirit for God to us. Below is a rendering of John chapter 16, verse 7 by the translators of the Amplified Bible that I find particularly enlightening. This verse gives many of the attributes of the Holy Spirit, in English, that are all packed and hidden in the original Greek Word parakletos. Each of the capitalized words in the verse below tells us how the Holy Spirit is ready to help us. All we have to do is ask with a short prayer like this: "Oh God, give me the awareness to know you are with me in all these ways through the Holy Spirit, Amen." WHO SHOULD RECEIVE HOLY COMMUNION, THE EUCHARIST, AT RAY OF HOPE CHURCH?

Everyone is invited to receive Holy Communion, also known as The Eucharist, The Lord's Table, or The Blessed Sacrament at Ray Of Hope Church Of Our Lord Jesus Christ, Inc.

It is not required that you be a member of this Church or any other church, to receive Holy Communion at / or with Ray Of Hope Church.

This Holy Communion is the Table of Jesus Christ, who is really present among us. Jesus invites you to receive Him in this Eucharistic banquet. If this is your first time receiving The Blessed Sacrament, let us know before you receive or right after, so we might pray a special prayer of thanksgiving with you.

Unfortunately, through the centuries many institutional churches have established rules, teachings, and practices that would exclude people from Holy Communion. There has been an August 8, 2021 19th Sunday of the Church Year B page: 38 almost endless list of reasons to exclude people from the Blessed Sacrament. Yet, together, during the worship service, we recite the very words of Jesus, the Words of Institution, "This is my body. This is my blood," and we rehear Christ present with us saying: "Take this, all of you and eat; Take this all of you and drink" of this gift.

I have thought about this extensively and have decided to take these words "Take this, all of you.." as a command to the Church to give, and bring, the Eucharistic Gift to everyone who will receive. This approach also requires us to teach people about this gift. Or as we like to say as one of our mottos, when we quote Fr. Bartholomew J. O'Brien; "You are as welcome here as Christ Himself."

Last month the House passed the <u>Equality Act (H.R. 5)</u>. For those unaware, this important legislation would amend existing civil rights laws, such as the *Civil Rights Act of 1964*, to include sexual orientation, and gender identity as protected characteristics under law. The bill also expands federal non-discrimination protections regarding discrimination based on race, color, national origin, **Religion**, sex, sexual orientation or gender identity in public settings, and protects against sex-based discrimination in government services and federally-funded programs.

This week, the Senate held its first ever hearing on the *Equality Act* and as expected, the debate was heated.

It seems opponents of the bill (Senate Republicans) are promoting several misconceptions about its purpose and scope which include:

- "The Equality Act would destroy religious freedom in this country."
 - NOT TRUE. Freedom of Religion is already protected by the First Amendment of the U.S. Constitution. Nothing in the *Equality Act* would change that. The bill simply extends those rights that most vulnerable groups are already afforded to those who have been denied them, such as the LGBTQ community. In fact, the bill actually protects freedom of Religion by preventing the imposing of one's Religion upon another.
- "The Equality Act will make athletics unfair for females."
 - NOT TRUE. Schools across the nation already have policies in place to ensure a level playing field for all students, and they are working. Additionally, except for a very small percentage, most students who participate in high school sports do not continue on with their athletic endeavours after high school. The possibility that perhaps one or two transgender students in an entire student body would ruin that opportunity for another is <u>almost nonexistent</u>. *Title IX* is extremely important in regards to girls athletics, and the bottom line is that nothing in the *Equality Act* changes that. Instead, we should be calling for increased funding for girls athletics.
- "The Equality Act_will allow men to harass women in public restrooms."
 - NOT TRUE. We already have laws in place to prevent such acts, and the *Equality Act* does nothing to change that. Additionally, **21 states** have had similar nondiscrimination laws on the books for decades now and they have worked, as there have been no increases in public safety incidents in bathrooms since they were codified.
