Ray Of Hope Church is not an organization, but it is a living organism, the Body Of Christ, or it does not exist. Ray Of Hope Church is Christ-centered in all of its teachings, and therefore does not ascribe to the dogmas, teachings, or practices of any singular contemporary denomination, or para-church organization of the Christian Church. Rather, we maintain an autonomous freedom to draw from the two millennia of immense riches known in all denominations of Christianity. The Holy Spirit has bestowed unique charisms to individuals and groups of reformers throughout the story of the Church. Experience has shown that often entire denominations have developed around a new gift from the Holy Spirit that was intended for the entire Body Of Christ, the Church Universal. Often, when these new charisms became locked into a denominational

system, they were never shared or made available to the rest of the Church. Ray Of Hope Church actively studies the entire story of the Church seeking to draw out these gifts and bring them together into our experience of Christianity. Our goal is to "hold that faith which has been believed everywhere, always, and by all." 1 Ray Of Hope is an "independent" local Church. This does not mean we stand alone, as though in pride or arrogance, rather we seek to share an interdependence with other assemblies and fellowships of believers who are also centered on Christ Jesus, and who endeavor equally as hard as we do to bring the Gospel to all people.

This method was first clearly formulated as a method by Vincent of Lerins in the fifth century. His famous statement has become a guidepost in this method: "guod semper, quod ubique, quod ab omnibus creditum sum" ("what has been believed always,

everywhere, and by all").

ARTICLE 1

INSPIRATION OF HOLY SCRIPTURE

We believe that the original autographs (the manuscripts that were signed by the original authors) 2 of the Holy Scripture, both the Hebrew Testament and the Christian Testament, are inerrantly inspired of God, that is "in spiro" or breathed into by God. Therefore the Bible participates in the supernatural and

perfect qualities of God. Consequently, the Bible contains God's Truth without error and thence provides God's people with an infallible authority in all matters of Faith and Doctrine. 2, 2a

Ray Of Hope publicly acknowledges the fact that the Universal Church has none of the original writings (autographs) of Holy Scriptures. Our English translations are therefore dependent on translators, and translation traditions that have sometimes been influenced by denominational and political agendas, even sometimes dictated by those who financially supported the work or "authorized" it. Admitting various levels of textual corruption due to translations does exist, our position on the "Inspiration Of Holy Scriptures" makes no claim to cover the preservation of the accuracy of the translated biblical transcripts. Inerrancy is claimed for the original manuscripts only as they came from the hands of their authors. At the center of our position on Inerrancy and Inspiration is the conviction that God did not, could not, and would not, convey the body of Truth that the Church is dependent upon, through an error-filled document. Therefore, we assert that copyist's errors do not invalidate the Inspired Inerrancy of the Bible. Ray Of Hope Church endorses and supports the continuing efforts of scholars who labor to purify our English translations, making them more accurate to the most ancient extant Hebrew, Aramaic, and Greek texts of Holy Scriptures. We do acknowledge the unfortunate reality that some English translations in fact do perpetuate errors in the translation, even sometimes intentionally, when compared to extant Hebrew, Aramaic and Greek manuscripts. Ray Of Hope Church is committed to exposing all known and proved errors in English translations of Scriptures, and we do not ascribe any authority to mistranslated texts for guidance in faith, doctrine, teaching, or practice, even when mistranslations are held in "affection" and/or "Sacred Tradition" even by the majority of profession Christendom. We believe God's Word is Truth, and that the Truth alone will set all Christians free, John 8:32, John 14:16, John 16:13, John 17:17-19,

THE WORD OF GOD IS TO BE STUDIED AND KNOWN BY THE PEOPLE

We are told to study the Word Of God by the biblical text itself. In the last 100 years, 2Tim 2:15 has been used as a banner verse for Scripture study. The King James Version (KJV) translated the Greek word "spoudazo" (English phoneticization) as "study." Recent translations, such as the NRSV have moved away from the optional selection of "study," in favor of other options. This may be an unfortunate reaction to some over emphasis on Bible Study by some. However, to "study" or "be diligent" or "do your best" in the regard to the Word Of God is all equally clear. Therefore, Ray Of Hope takes seriously the task of teaching the Scriptures. 2Timothy 2:15; Colossians 3:16; Psalm 1:8; 19:7-11; 119.; Joshua 1:8; 2Timothy 3:16-17; Nehemiah 8:8;





NRSV 2 Tim 2:15 <u>Do your best</u> to present yourself to God as one approved by him, a worker who has no need to be ashamed, rightly explaining the word of truth.

KJV: 2 Tim 2:15 Study to show thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed,

"Blessed are those who hear the Word Of God, and live it out!" Luke 11:28; Romans 2:13; Jams 1:22-25.

Further, we reject the false teaching that the Bible is "too difficult" for the common person to understand, and should only be left to the clergy to read. The Scripture makes it perfectly clear that God did not write the Word to keep it from the understanding of the People Of God. We ask what kind of God would make a people dependent on God's own Word for life ("We do not live on bread alone, but by every word that proceeds from the mouth of God..") and then give that word in a written style that the people could not understand? This would not be done by a loving God! Deuteronomy 29:29; 30: 11-14; Joshua 1:8 We depend on the teaching ministry of the Holy Spirit to guide us in our study of the Word Of God, as promised in 1John 2:27, and John 16:13.



ARTICLE 2

A WORKING DEFINITION OF DOCTRINE AND DOGMA

Ray Of Hope Church defines a Doctrine as an unchangeable truth that is essential to the Christian Faith. Dogmas, on the contrary, are defined as those ideas and developed principles that carry authority in the Faith Community because they are based upon an opinion or idea that is put forth by whomever is given the task to make such decisions and pronouncements. Teachings and practices come under the category of dogmatics. We define a teaching as a local, global, or even historic <u>dogmatic idea or custom</u> that may be based on Scripture, or may be based on an historical development in theology, moral ethics, church polity, etc. We define practices as the <u>dogmatic and agreed upon applications</u>, lived expression(s) of believed doctrine, and/or adapted policies and teachings of the Faith Community, such as areas of ministry or worship customs. Dogma: that is, teachings and practices may change, and do change, but they are never allowed to be in conflict with the inspired Doctrines of the Christian Faith.
