The bell was a gift from Michael Quinnell of Syracuse, NY in 2005. The bell rings out 39 joyful rings, in contrast to tolling the bell in single rings. The 39 joyful rings are in honor of the 39 lashes Jesus endured that we now celebrate in victory and gratitude for our salvation. "The chastisement for our peace was upon Him, And by His stripes we are healed." (Isaiah 53:5) We always ring the bell before worship and Bible Enrichment sessions. Listen carefully and see if you can hear all 39 rings.

WE GATHER TO PRAISE THE LORD AND TO GIVE THANKS

+ Pastoral Welcome

Veronica Floyd, Moderator of Ray Of Hope Church: Good morning and welcome. My name is Veronica Floyd and I am the Moderator of Ray Of Hope Church Of Our Lord Jesus Christ, a faith community in Central New York where everyone is welcome. It is our turn to host an Elmira Clergy all city worship event this morning. We welcome the other member churches: Bethany Lutheran Church, The United Baptist Church, St. Matthew's Episcopal Church, Grace Episcopal Church, Trinity Episcopal Church, New Beginnings United Methodist Church, and the Webb Mills United Methodist Church. There are eight congregations worshiping together this morning. This is a power house of the Lord in prayer today. Today is the Elmira Area Clergy

group's first virtual worship event and is reaching all over the Country through the Internet. In fact, I am coming to you from my home in John's Creek in Georgia, just north of Atlanta. You might remember in 2013 I flew up from Georgia for our service that was held at the Trinity Episcopal Church in their gym.

Today we also meet with the special circumstances of the COVID-19 worldwide pandemic that is touching every community. In fact today a nation-wide group of families of COVID victims and survivors are leading a National COVID-19 Remembrance Day with a ceremony at Noon in Washington, D.C.. We join them in spirit and in truth as we worship this morning. So many people have been sick, some have been sick and are in various stages of recovery, and many have come to the end of their lives unexpectedly due to this virus. We reach out with love, empathy, and compassion to those family members who are grieving the loss of loved ones at this time. In this situation, we, the faith community of Jesus Christ, bring the eternal message of "the Lord is with you" to everyone around us. So, we offer today's worship event as a spiritual sacrifice of praise, thanksgiving and hope to God for the wellbeing and safety of people everywhere and an end to this pandemic.

Lisa Frost: My name is Lisa Frost and I am the Treasurer of Ray Of Hope Church. Today, October 4, is also the Feast of St. Francis of Assisi. He lived from 1182 to October 3, 1226, therefore his homecoming to the Lord is celebrated on October 4 all over the world. Francis renounced wealth to become a servant brother and possibly a deacon, but was never ordained a Priest. Christians of all denominations celebrate his love for the Lord and all of God's creation. He not only preached to the animals, but also invited them into church buildings for worship. Today we welcome a set of readings chosen especially for the Feast of St. Francis because they are also perfectly appropriate for World Communion Sunday which, in fact, has been going on in places around the Earth since the first minute of the day in Greenwich, England at the prime meridian many hours ago! The celebration has been rolling across the earth since then and will continue until the end of the day. It is truly a worldwide event.

Veronica Floyd: God created one Human Race, only one human species, one People. Everyone is welcome here today; persons of all Nationalities, ethnicities, denominations, genders, and sexual orientation. St. Paul exhorts believers to "receive one another, just as Christ also received us to the glory of God" in Romans Chapter 15:7. You are as welcome here as Christ Jesus himself. Take a moment now and wave across the room, or into the camera, and across the Internet to each other as we welcome one another in the Name of Christ for the glory of God.

The Rev. Shawn Benedict: We begin in the name of God, the Christ, and the Holy Spirit. **ALL:** Amen.

The Rev. Shawn Benedict: The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit is with you. **ALL: And also with you.**

The Rev. Shawn Benedict: As you know, we are not supposed to have large choirs yet during our COVID-19 infection prevention plans. So, I came up with the idea of using the DVD recording of our 2013 worship event, when Helen Vincent beautifully directed a very large combined choir and we had so many guest musicians from all over the County. I hope you can remember that glorious worship event. Using the recording is sort of the next best thing to being there. We will recognize ourselves and our friends in the video and we will remember the songs. I should also note we will also see a few of our sisters and brothers who have since gone home to be with the Lord in these video clips. When we see them, let us give thanks and praise that we are witnesses to their Faith, we sang with them, and so we know where they are, with Jesus. Follow the directions of your Pastors in your particular location as to if you can sing out loud during the music. So here we go.

+ The Candle Of Hope

Whitney Tipton: Good Morning. My name is Whitney Tipton, I attend Ray Of Hope on line every week. I am coming to you from Sandy Springs, Georgia. Every week we light our Resurrection Candle Of Hope at this

time. With this light we give our witness that we believe in the resurrection of all the dead, and we are looking forward to that moment when Christ shall call the Church home. Ken Ryan will light our Candle of Hope in the Elmira Chapel now. If you have a candle at home you could light now and show in the camera that would be awesome. If those of you who are in a sanctuary could light your Christ Candle, Resurrection Candle or a special candle and show us by turning your camera toward it that would be wonderful too.

Kenneth Ryan: Hello. My name is Ken Ryan and I am from Ray Of Hope Church. Please join me silently in this prayer. Lord Jesus, we light this candle to remind ourselves to pray for all the sick and all those who are mourning the loss of loved ones. Amen. It is our custom to read names from the Names Project AIDS Memorial Quilt, and we will do that today. We are also going to read names that were submitted to remember before God of those who have been infected with or affected by COVID-19. To help us not forget their lives we say aloud the names of many who have passed, and those who are sick at this time.

Whitney Tipton: I will start with Names from the Quilt.

<u>Jackie Draht</u>: Hello. My name is Jackie Draht and I am from St. Matthew's Episcopal Church. I will read the names submitted by the various congregations for those affected by COVID-19.

<u>Jackie Draht</u>: May the candle's flame remind us of the joy and happiness known in life, the comfort offered us by the Holy Spirit in our loss, and the "blessed hope" we have in the resurrection of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

ALL: AMEN



+ Confession and Forgiveness of our sins.

<u>Debbie Todd</u>: Hello. My name is Debbie Todd and I attend Grace Episcopal Church with Michele Sanford and our priest Mother Jenny Scott-Jones. At this time we prepare our hearts to receive the Word of God and the Sacrament of Communion by confessing our sins in silence to Christ. (silent prayer)

Debbie: We now pray together:

Michele:



As an introduction to this reading we want to remember that Francis of Assisi was wandering in the hills on the outskirts of Assisi when he came upon a little church that was falling apart named San Damiano. He entered and knelt before a very large wooden icon of the Crucifix. Suddenly the eyes of Jesus seemed to open. Francis asked, "Lord, what do you want me to do? Show me what you want me to do with my life." Clearly and audibly a voice said; "Francis, go and rebuild my church which, as you see is falling down." Francis began what started out as a physical rebuilding project and soon turned into a renewal ministry

that continues through Franciscan inspired ministries all over the world to this day. Truly, Francis built upon the solid rock, Christ. In our first reading this morning we are exhorted to do the same.

Our first reading is in the Book of Jeremiah, chapter 22, verses 13-16.

Lisa Frost: Please set down your Holy Communion cup and bread on your Table or Altar. Please be seated. At Ray Of Hope Church I am one of the licensed Servants of the Eucharist, our Eucharistic ministers, so I will assist us at this time. Please be sure your microphone or audio is muted in your Zoom window at this time. Continue to leave your speakers on so you can hear what is happening in the Zoom room. Today we will receive our first virtual ecumenical Eucharist together. It will be in three steps.

Step Number 1) Some people are watching from a location where they do not have actual Holy Communion Bread and Wine with them. We will all now pray with them this prayer from the Episcopal National Cathedral Prayer book for a Spiritual reception of Holy Communion that gives all the benefits and blessings of a physical reception. Together we pray with them:

Oh My Jesus, I believe that you are truly present in the Blessed Sacrament of the Altar. I love you above all things, and long for you in my soul. Since I cannot receive you in the Sacrament of your Body and Blood, come spiritually into my heart. Cleanse and strengthen me with your grace, Lord Jesus, and let me never be separated from you. May I live in you, and you in me, in this life and in the life to come. Amen.

Spiritual Communion Prayer from the Episcopal National Cathedral Prayer Book.

A spiritual communion is a personal devotional that anyone can pray at any time to express their desire to receive Holy Communion at that moment, but in which circumstances impede them from actually receiving Holy Communion.

Step Number 2) Those who are with Pastors in churches and sanctuaries please begin to receive Holy Communion now. Follow the instructions of your Pastors and your COVID-19 infection prevention policies. Please begin to serve now.

Step Number 3) Now, for everyone who has Holy Communion at home; if you are with someone, you may give Holy Communion to each other. For everyone receiving at home I declare: The Body and Blood of Jesus Christ for you. Amen. Please now receive the bread and drink all of the wine or grape juice. Please gather all the bread crumbs into the cup and add some water and be sure to drink all of the wine or grape juice and all of the crumbs. Then dry your cup please.

We will now sing together verse three of Here I am Lord.
