#### Sermon Notes: Br. Shawn Benedict, Pastor.

Worship is our primary activity as a church. There is an old standard in the church, lex orandi, lex credendi which means that "the law of prayer is the law of faith" or "that which we pray is that which we believe." Our prayer, our worship is the key to understanding what God has revealed for us to accept as true. Our congregation offers the leadership, organization, presentation of worship experiences, and the physical building space for worship and education in spirituality as our primary service to the general public. Last week we celebrated the fact that Ray Of Hope has always been a faith plus works church. As we celebrated the 22nd anniversary of our first worship event in the Southern Tier, we noted so many of the ways we have put our faith into action as a congregation. Just as last week so this week in this Gospel it is all about acknowledging who Jesus is. This is the primary message of Ray Of Hope Church, who Jesus is and why this is so important for ALL people of every sexual orientation and

every gender expression, even as we continue to discover

more of both of them.

Many times people ask how this old book the Bible can be relevant for today. Today's readings have three layers to them:

1—the actual historicity of the events described for the people of that time and place, 2—the voice of Jesus in prophecy in the first reading, the voice of Jesus as Head of His Church in the second reading, and prophecy fulfilled in the Gospel as He explains the kind of death he would endure for our salvation. But the 3rd level is universal truth regarding how people do things to sabotage good works. How interesting it is that people seem to sometimes get satisfaction out of setting up other people's failures and lack of success. We see this all through life from sibling fighting with children, to in-school bullying and cheating to get ahead, to problems on the job with in-fighting, to dishonest and even criminal corruption all through every lev-

el of commerce and politics even up to a world scope. What the Scriptures are telling us is people using cheating, problem causing, and tearing others down has been around since the beginning of sin in the world. With this knowledge we can be sure we do not participate in it, and when we find we have participated, to correct our ways and clean up out paths. No one is immune from sin and failure, only God exists like that and Christ proved that with living his sinless life.

The second reading is our continued study on the Book of James. The Book of James is an instruction book on how to understand the life of being a Christian and a part of the Church in our modern day. The wisdom contained in these verses has proven timeless.

The verses today address when the church itself deals with envy, selfish ambition, disorder, fighting, quarrels, and so on. Read the second reading again. What is and what has always been the solution and weapons against these kinds of problems? Prayer, right relationship with each other and with God, Scripture study, and applied living principles we learn and focus on in the church. We can always grow and improve on all of these things. The Scriptures are here as our divine guide to living out God's will.
